Dear Parents, Guardians and Caregivers of Students in Health and/or Wellness 1 & 2,

The Rochester Community Schools Board of Education has established an age-appropriate program of instruction in health education for students in kindergarten through twelfth grade, in accordance with the Michigan Department of Education (MDE) and state regulations.

The MDE K-12 Health Education Committee created Reproductive Health and Human Sexuality Education guidelines that provide districts with best practices. Public school districts are required to teach about dangerous communicable diseases, including, but not limited to, HIV/AIDS. Age-appropriate instruction must be offered at least once a year at every building level including elementary, middle and high school.

In the upcoming weeks, we will be teaching the reproductive health/human sexuality and HIV/AIDS components of our health education curriculum. The concepts included in this unit are:

1. Describe the impact of personal health behaviors on the functioning of the reproductive systems and processes.
2. Understand the processes of fertilization, fetal development, and birth.
3. Analyze the short-term and long-term consequences of safe, risky, and harmful behaviors.
4. Analyze how sexual abstinence is the best, safest, and healthiest choice to prevent pregnancy and sexually transmitted infections and protect one's emotional health.
5. Understand that condoms and other contraceptives may reduce the risk of pregnancy and some, but not all, sexually transmitted infections.
6. Demonstrate the ability to utilize various strategies when making decisions and communicating with family, peers and others regarding sexual health.
7. Demonstrate refusal, negotiation, and collaboration skills to avoid potentially harmful situations, such as dating violence.
8. Analyze the role of public health policies and laws in the prevention of dating violence and control of disease.
9. Express information and opinions about sexual health issues.

Classroom presentations will include approved materials, a discussion of concepts, and a question-and-answer segment. Please feel free to contact your child's health or wellness teacher if you have concerns.

Materials review

In accordance with the State School Aid Act for FY 94, you have the right to review the materials and curriculum content to be used in these courses. An outline of the specific course or grade-level content is included with this letter. Instructional materials, which include teacher guides, student texts (if applicable), and reproductive health films, will be available for your preview consideration. Additionally, a representative from the SHARE organization (Sexual Health and Relationships Education) will be presenting information promoting positive choices and the benefits of remaining abstinent.

We may utilize the following audio-visual materials in our classroom study: "The Latest About HIV/AIDS." Copies of the video are available at the Rochester Hills Public Library and may be checked out on a limited basis.

Families are encouraged to review the materials to facilitate discussion at home. You are invited to attend an informative parent preview session. If your child is enrolled in Health, Wellness 1 or Wellness 2 for this school

year, **the preview session is scheduled for September 25, at 6 p.m. in the Rochester High School Media Center**, located at 1361 Walton Blvd in Rochester Hills.

Please note that this is the only preview session scheduled. If you are unable to attend, copies of the video are available at the Rochester Hills Public Library. If you would like to check out videos from the public library, please bring this letter with you to the Youth Services Desk for assistance.

Family options

By law, parents have the right to observe reproductive health instruction in their child's classroom. They may also excuse their child, without penalty, from participation in the unit containing reproductive health, HIV/AIDS, and/or other serious communicable disease information. Please complete the district opt-out form for reproductive health education if you wish to exempt your child or if you wish to observe classroom instruction.
