Dear Coronado Community,

Do students really need to take standardized tests? Test-optional policies have been adopted by some colleges and universities, and taking tests may be very stressful for students. Whether you want to pursue higher education or apply to the trades, the military, or dive right into a career, the standardized SAT, PSAT, and CMAS science is worth the time it takes to prepare and sit for the exam.

The benefits of completing the SAT, PSAT, and CMAS science outweigh the negatives. Standardized testing helps identify a student's strengths and weaknesses, it helps track academic growth, and can prepare students for future standardized testing that is prevalent in almost every career field. Its purpose is to measure a student's readiness for college and career. Standardized test scores are an important part of the college application process, scholarship are awarded to high scorers, and even some job applications request test scores. SAT scores can also satisfy the career and college readiness demonstration required for graduation. The test administered in April are free to all Coronado students. If you were to take the test on your own the cost would be \$60.

Standardized test also benefits schools. Standardized testing serves as benchmark to identify students needing additional help or acceleration. They help identify teachers who may need extra training and help schools allocate resources. Standardized tests play an important role in our school performance framework and improvement plan.

Coronado's Unified Improvement Plan (UIP) Major Improvement Strategy # 1



targets improving student performance on standardized tests. Coronado teachers have been working hard to prepare students for the new digital SAT and PSAT that was rolled out in 2024. Coronado has also partnered with Smart Prep Colorado and Sage affordable tutoring to offer additional free PSAT/SAT prep for interested students on Monday mornings beginning in February. We are confident that all this preparation will help students achieve their potential on testing days.

Coronado is planning to offer special breakfasts and snacks on testing days in April to make sure students are nourished and ready to perform their best. We planning to offer other incentives for student participation and engagement to help all our students be prepared. Please help us out by ensuring your student is well rested and in the right mindset to do their best during testing. Please avoid scheduling any appointments that would cause them to miss their testing time on April 15, 16, or 17.

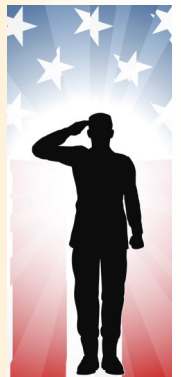
FOR ALL MALES

17 or 18 YEARS OLD

Federal law requires that all males register with Selective Service within 30 days of their 18th birthday.

Students can submit their registration information on the Internet at www.sss.gov or by filling out a form that is available at any post office.

Selective Service registration is required in order to be eligible for a federal student loan, job training, most federal jobs, and U.S. Citizenship.

Graduation Requirements for the State of Colorado

The new graduation requirements continue with the Class of 2024 and can be met in multiple ways. The first way to accomplish this is through meeting a testing score on the ASVAB, SAT, or ACT tests. A second way to meet this is to take an AP class, or concurrent enrollment class. Finally, a student may do Work Keys (a system of assessments), an Industry Certificate, or a Performance Evaluation. Counselors will help each student find their path.

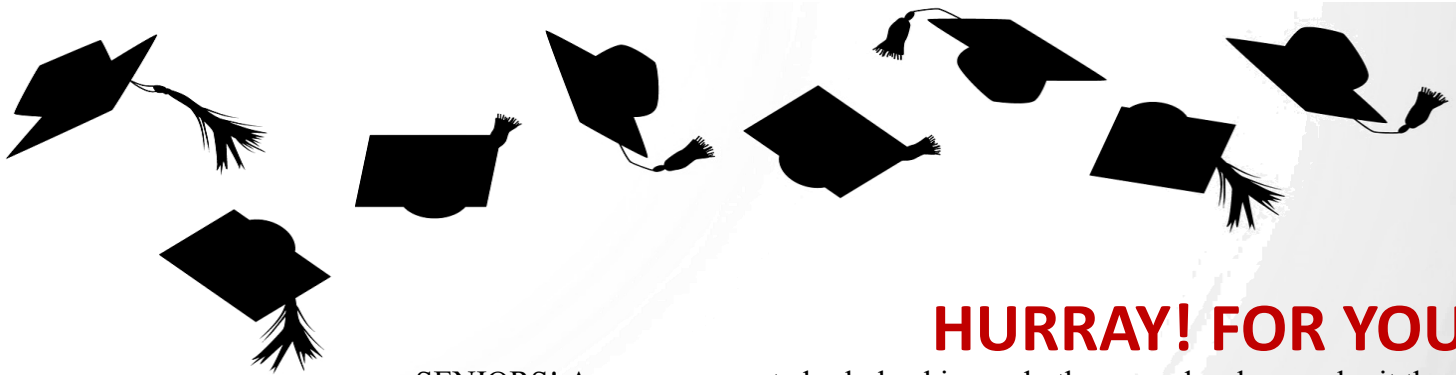

AP EXAM INFORMATION— Reminders!

Based on recent information provided by the College Board, Coronado's AP exams will be administered **May 6- May 17** at Coronado High School, all in-person, with most exams held in the Auxiliary Gym, respecting College Board testing guidelines. More information will become available from the College Board in April. By March 9, students should confirm with their AP instructor that an exam had been ordered, or indicate if they wish to drop their exam. Most students registered last fall for their AP exams.

Second semester class, AP Microeconomics, has until March 9 to register—check with Mr. Schottler for registration information or you can check the Coronado homepage at <https://www.d11.org/coronado>, under Departments—GT/CU Succeed/AP Exams, or contact Mrs. Wetta at valerie.wetta@d11.org, or 719.328.3631. No late fee is assessed since this is a second semester class, only.

School District 11 will pay all AP exam fees for student exams; however, if any student still wishes to late register for exams or pull out of exams that they have already registered for, they will be charged \$40.00 to be paid through the Coronado Business Office by **March 15, or will be put on obligation.**

Students are expected report to their exam on the assigned time and date of their test. Mrs. Wetta will send out confirmation in regard to test dates, times, and locations. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact Mrs. Wetta at valerie.wetta@d11.org.

AP Testing Emergencies, Accommodations & Reminders

Please check with Mrs. Wetta as soon as possible if there are any emergencies or conflicts that arise. Accommodations for students must already be requested to the College Board. Please see your counselor and/or Mrs. Wetta if there are any conflicts or concerns regarding accommodations.

REMINDER: Students should request AP scores be sent to the college of their choice if they want their exam scores to be considered. **Many U.S. colleges grant credit and/or advanced placement (meaning they let you skip the equivalent course once you get to college) for scores of 3 and above.** Students can code their college request through their College Board account, or they may wish to see their scores in July prior to sending to the college of their choice.
