CPR Heartsaver Course, March 13th

There are openings for the annual Certified Heart Saver CPR training to take place on 3/13/2025 from 2:30 -4:30pm in Ms. Dore's room. The cost is \$55.00 (with a rebate given back to your class). Certification Cards will be given upon completion of the course. This certification is good to have if you are thinking of applying for any camp counselor positions, babysitting jobs, or restaurant work. Get ahead of the requirements they will be looking for. Southcoast Health Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) Applications



Applications are now open for the Southcoast Health Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) Training Program. The application deadline is March 14th. The six-week paid training program begins May 19, 2025.

This part-time, 32-hour per week program is offered quarterly and focuses on providing the knowledge and competencies required for the Massachusetts Certified

Nursing Assistant examination. Anyone that meets the minimum qualifications is welcome to apply. Participants will learn the theoretical concepts, principles and skills to care for patients in the acute care and long-term care settings, using the recommended practices established by the Massachusetts Nurse Aide Registry.

The six-week program consists of a classroom portion that includes lectures, skills lab practice and observational experiences on the inpatient care units at St. Luke's Hospital in New Bedford, MA and clinical rotation at a local rehabilitation facility.

- Clinical Time: 7am-3:30pm (3 days per week, variable days)
- Classroom Time: 8am-4:30pm (1 day per week, variable days)
- Pay Rate during training is \$16/hr.
- Costs covered for text and workbook, one scrub set and certification exam fee

Upon completion of the training program and certification, participants will be expected to continue to work at one of Southcoast Health's three hospitals in a full-time or part-time nursing assistant position for a minimum period of 1 year. Positions are available at Charlton Memorial Hospital in Fall River, St. Luke's Hospital in New Bedford and Tobey Hospital in Wareham. Shifts will vary.


Hawthorn Medical Associates Scholarship

Rob Roy Scholarships for Cosmetology/Barber Programs and Esthetics

Rob Roy Academy offers two different scholarships for upcoming 2025 graduates.



- o \$1000.00 scholarships for our Cosmetology & Barber programs
- o \$600 scholarships for the Esthetics Program

Scholarships will be awarded to graduates with a sincere desire to enter the fields of Cosmetology or Barbering. Below are the eligibility criteria for students applying for the scholarship:

- o Must be scheduled to graduate in the 2025 academic year
- o Submit a completed admission application
- o Enroll for either 1000 hours of Cosmetology, 1000 hours of Barbering or 600 hours of Esthetics
- o Provide one letter of recommendation (ex. Guidance counselor, teacher, employer, non-family member)
- o Submit two of the following for review:
 - 1. 250+ Word Essay explaining their career goals and why they want to become either a Barber or Cosmetologist. And/Or,
 - 2. Two pieces of creative work, such as pictures of hairstyles, nail work, or make up that the applicant has personally created. And/Or,
 - 3. A 3-minute video telling RRA about the applicant, their career goals, and why they want to become a Barber or Cosmetologist.

Once a student submits the scholarship requirements to the Admissions Department at lpina@rob-roy.com for consideration, the Admissions Department will be in contact with them for an interview. All scholarships are awarded at the completion of their program. Students must enroll on or before the September 2025 class start date and are expected to retain the scholarship by meeting satisfactory academic progress.
