

Gideon Mantell wrote a scientific paper naming the Iguanodon species of dinosaur. He presented it to the Royal Society in 1825.

His discovery was inspired by fossilised teeth that his wife Mary Ann found. Mary Ann and Gideon discovered many fossils in the earth in Sussex on the south coast of England. They were already familiar with fossils of "turtles, birds, fishes, shells and vegetables". Finding fossilised teeth that looked different was very exciting.

Share your personal creative approach: write in prose, poetry, with pictures. It's your choice.


Word count: up to 150 words Prizes for the most creative writing.
