Course Description:

In AP World History: Modern, students will investigate significant events, individuals, developments and processes from 1200 to the present, with a brief review of important foundational topics. The students will explore connections among themes, such as humans and the environment, cultural developments and interactions, governance, and economic systems.

Course Rationale:

AP World History: Modern student will read and write extensively on themes, topics, and connections throughout world history. Understanding these themes and topics is essential to being an ethical and global citizen.

Course Objectives:

- The student will analyze and discuss historical periods in world history, including world religions, cultures, and systems of government. (A+ Speaking and Listening)
- The student will read, interpret, and debate primary and secondary source documents in the context of analyzing historical events and trends. (A+ Reading)
- The student will utilize documents to develop and write arguments and support them with evidence and reasoning. (A+ Writing)
- The student will use academic databases, primary and secondary sources, and library resources to research historical topics and to provide support for arguments. (A+ Research).

• The student will discuss and analyze the impact of geography and environment on human history and the impact of human history on geography and the environment.
