Course Description:	
Honors World History is the analysis of global history since 1450 with an emphasis on historical inquiry, use of evidence and recognizing different perspectives. This course will examine changes throughout World History including governmental, cultural, economic, and geographical. Honors World students will pose questions, create arguments and engage in inquiry about the development of history as it relates to our present day cultures and situations while focusing on what it means to be a part of humanity.	
Course Rationale:	
Students in Honors World will read extensively and dive deeper into an understanding of what it has meant to be human and what it means to be part of humanity at different times and places since 1450, evaluating the roles that human interaction, technology, and belief systems have had on our past and present.
