## **Course Description:**

Two-Dimensional Art Foundations is an introductory level course that provides a solid foundation in the fundamentals of 2-D art production as well as an understanding of aesthetics, art criticism and art history. The student will work with the art elements and principles of design while concentrating on 2-D art forms such as drawing, design, printmaking, and painting. A variety of media will be incorporated throughout the course. Two-Dimensional Art Foundations satisfies the prerequisite requirements for: Drawing I, Painting I, Photography I, Mixed Media and Digital Art I. This course has a \$5.00 lab fee.

## **Course Rationale:**

The Two-Dimensional Art Foundations course will promote learning in art studio production, criticism, and art history and expand student knowledge, understanding and sensitivity in and about two-dimensional art forms. The course provides the visual literacy necessary to enable students to produce and interpret images in our visually-oriented world. The student will gain insights into the artworks produced by others and create their own artworks with different media and techniques.

## **Course Objectives:**

- The student will produce a series of drawings in a variety of media that demonstrate use of line, value, perspective, and proportion.
- The student will demonstrate knowledge of color theory through production and criticism. (A+ Writing)
- The student will research and produce a painting that demonstrates proficiency in painting techniques and color mixing. (A+ Research)
- The student will produce and critique a graphic design applying the elements and principles of art. (A+ Speaking and Listening)
- The student will demonstrate competency in the use of printing tools and materials and successful execution of the printing process.
- The student will demonstrate knowledge of aesthetics, art criticism and art history obtained through various resources through written assignments.(A+ Reading)
