Course Description:

Sculpture is a studio emphasis art course enriched with content from art history, art criticism, and aesthetics. A number of units will be addressed beginning with an exploration of materials such as (clay, plaster, paper, adhesives, ect.), sculptural artwork, artists, societal influences, and artistic expression. This study is followed by instruction that focuses on the student's development of their own ideas in sculptural form. Within the course, the student is presented with a variety of media and techniques used to form relief and sculpture-in-the-round. This course has a \$10 lab fee.

Course Rationale:

Sculpture is a three-dimensional art form that provides an understanding of form and space. This course focuses on the importance of problem solving concerning; planning, proportion, construction, light, balance and aesthetically pleasing form. Sculpture develops visual literacy, spatial intelligence, dexterous abilities, three-dimensional problem-solvings skills, risk-taking, and an understanding of the use of various media.

Course Objectives:

- The student will work with a variety of materials to produce sculptural artworks that demonstrate quality craftsmanship, form, and creative composition assessed by a scoring guide and self reflection. (A+: Speaking and listening)
- The student will demonstrate an understanding of critical analysis by creating a response addressing description, analysis, interpretation, and judgment. (A+: Writing)
- The student will investigate cultural influences and create connections tied to three dimensional art. (A+:Reading)

• The student will research sculptural artwork and create connections with, artists, societal influences, artistic expression and art terminology. (A+:Research)
