Course Description:

Sculpture II builds on the skills learned in Sculpture I with an emphasis on student choice of materials and techniques. Sculpture is a studio art course enriched with content from art history, art criticism, and aesthetics. A number of units will be addressed beginning with a sustained investigation of materials such as (clay, plaster, paper, adhesives, etc.), sculptural artwork, artists, societal influences, and artistic expression. This course incorporates instruction that focuses on self-awareness, development of the students' ideas, and constructing small and large scale forms. This course has a \$10 lab fee.

Course Rationale:

Sculpture is a three-dimensional art form that provides an understanding of form and space in a real world context. This course focuses on how sculpture functions as an integral part of our community. Sculpture develops visual literacy, spatial intelligence, dexterous abilities, three-dimensional problem-solving skills, risk-taking, and an understanding of the use of sculptural materials.

Course Objectives:

- The student will develop a series of sculptural works that involve choice of material and technique that demonstrate quality craftsmanship, form, and creative composition.
- The student will demonstrate an understanding of exhibiting work and critical analysis by creating and art responses addressing description, analysis, interpretation, and judgment. (A+ Speaking and Listening)
- The student will read about and investigate cultural influences from current real world context and create connections to their community. (A+ Reading)
- The student will research classical and contemporary sculpture and sculptors to create connections to societal influences, artistic expression and art terminology. (A+Research, A+ Writing)
