<u>Pick Your Own Field Trip</u>: Begins with a 90 minute "Animal Experience" and "Tractor Drawn Wagon Ride. <u>Animal Experience</u>: Learn about the variety of animals that reside here at the Suffolk County Farm and the special role they play. Students will learn many fun facts about them while getting a real hands-on experience touching and feeding.

<u>Tractor-Drawn Wagon Ride:</u> For all ages This is a fun way to experience the breadth of the farm and all of its workings. Passengers will visit some of our livestock while enjoying a ride around the fields viewing the crops we plant and the equipment we use.

Fall Pumpkin Picking: Children see and feed the many farm animals and giraffes, our endangered ringtail lemurs, Australian red kangaroos, camels, Patches, the giraffe and many others. Children are able to hand feed goats, sheep, cows, alpacas, antelope and more! Animal information signs make this a fun, learning experience. Trip includes seeing and feeding the animals and: - Musical hayride through the cornfield. - Picking own pumpkin in field to fit in the provided pumpkin bag. - Educational coloring book on pumpkins and the farm to take home with them.

Students may bring lunch and picnic on grounds.
