<u>Trial of Goldilocks presented by Milestales</u>- Introductions to the basic elements storytelling and the legal system, *Understanding the classic fable Goldilocks with storytelling concepts such as rising action, climax, falling action, plot, character analysis, and more

- Understanding the function of criminal laws in American society
- Defining the criminal act and the various crimes that implicated in the story
- Exploring the participants of a trail and their roles
- Ethnicity, socio-economic status, employment status, age, education, and geography
- Discussing the various punishments that individuals receive and how punishment impact them.
- Brainstorming creative ways to deal with criminal activity.

Students complete assignments on story analysis, play analysis, and reflection on the topic of prejudice. This program culminates with students conducting a mock trail of Goldilocks using the play provided.
