AJK Diversified was established in January of 2007 to address long Island's growing need to understand and adapt to the ethnic/cultural changes on Long Island's Nassau and Suffolk school districts for personnel and student training. We work in conjunction with various agencies including Eastern Suffolk BOCES.

Alisty Keneth's sessions are dynamic, interactive, cutting edge and tailored to address specific issues utilized in antisocial behavior such as texting, Tik Tok, Snapchat, Twitter, Instagram, Twitch, Game chat and more.

<u>Electronic Safety 101:</u> Discusses the potential danger that come from online interactions as well as the protections students must take to be safe online.

<u>Bullying 101: Triggered:</u> Learn the scope of behaviors that can be defined as bullying and how to identify bullying victims. Workshop brings viable methods kids can use if targeted for bullying and empowers the 90% of witnesses to bullying behavior, to intervene when bullying occurs.

<u>Sexting 101:</u> Refers to sharing nude photos via cellphone or on their devices and the serious legal and psychological consequences and charges of producing, distribution, or possession of child pornography.

AJK Diversified has participated on several town and county Anti-Bias Task Forces, conference planning committees and event organizing panels including the Anti-Bias Task Force of Nassau County Human Rights Commission & the Nassau County Interagency Council.
