## EARLY CHILDHOOD SCREENING

Early Childhood Screening supports children's readiness for kindergarten and promotes health and development. Screening is a free and simple check that may link families to early learning opportunities and resources such as, Early Childhood Family Education, preschool programs, Early Childhood Special Education, Early Learning Scholarships, home visiting programs and more. Screening is ideally performed closest to age 3.

## CHARGER KIDS CLUB: school-age child care

Each student is unique and special and at Charger Kids Club, we strive to provide a safe and fun environment for all. Charger Kids Club (CKC) is a school-age child care program for students in preschool through 5th grade. We provide programming focusing on social, emotional, and creative development. Our caring staff offer a wide variety of programming including arts and crafts, individual and group activities, lots of fresh air on our playgrounds, and so much more!

We offer care before school from 6:00-8:00 am and after school from 3:00-6:00 pm. On non-school days and during the summer months, the program is open from 6:00 am-6:00 pm. During the school year, Charger Kids Club is located at both Cokato and Dassel Elementaries. However in the summer months it moves to the High School/Middle School campus. This allows students to take advantage of summer community education programs and amenities such as the swimming pool, playgrounds, gymnasiums, and DC Rec Center.

Little Chargers Childcare offers wraparound childcare services to enrolled DC Play and Learn preschool students in two locations: Cokato Elementary and the DC Community Ed. and Early Childhood Center. Our program is a balanced, high-quality opportunity focused on social, emotional, and creative development. Our dedicated staff provides a nurturing, fun, and safe environment for students for our youngest students.

This program is not an extension of preschool but rather supports it through fun, theme-based activities. It's important to give children the ability to play and choose how they play. We believe in supporting this by offering several opportunities to do so throughout the day.

## YOUTH ENRICHMENT

STEM classes offer students exciting opportunities to develop technology skills while learning how to collaborate, plan, design, and solve problems. A variety of STEM courses are offered including:

- COR Robotics Summer Camps
- FIRST Lego League
- Robotics Club

We were extremely excited to partner with Fungus Amongus this summer to offer a week-long theatre camp. Giving students the opportunity to develop their theatre and acting skills in a fun and interactive environment, these young actors explored ways to express their creativity and spontaneity as well as build their confidence. Over 40 students in grades 1 through 8 participated in this offering which culminated in a showcase performance for friends, family and fellow campers.

Students developed their musical skills through MS jazz band. Baking, cooking and cookie decorating classes are always popular for our young aspiring chefs. Babysitting and safe-at-home courses were offered to students to help them be better prepared while home alone or watch other children.

## **AQUATICS**

Community Education staffs the High School Pool with a variety of aquatic programs, including Red Cross Swimming Lessons, Aquacise (water aerobics), Lap Swim, Open Swim, Competitive Swim Club, Special Events and Private Rentals.

Lifeguards and water safety instructors are certified through the American Red Cross. The majority of staff are current high school students and returning college students. To help secure staff, Community Education offsets training expenses in return for commitment to our aquatics team. We were excited to add a new Pool Manager, Kim Ortloff, to our team. Kim comes to us with many years of experience in coaching and teaching swim lessons. She has been a great asset to our staff as one of her primary roles is to help develop the skills of our swim instructors.

Swim lessons were offered throughout the school year, and multiple daily and evening sessions were held during the summer. We have found a great deal of success offering swim lessons on Sunday afternoons and have seen a continual rise in the demand for families seeking private lessons. A summer partnership with Annandale Community Education enabled the neighboring students to participate in swim lessons that are otherwise not offered in their community.

A D-C satellite location of the High Tides Swim Club of Hutchinson continues to be a popular option for dedicated swimmers. Students have the option to swim multiple times a week to expand and maintain their stroke skills while building endurance.



## ADULT **ACTIVITIES**

A variety of learning opportunities are created for adults which enhance continuing education for all ages and supports a lifetime educational journey.

New and different classes continued to be offered to determine what fits the needs of our community. Many adults took advantage of skating & hockey offerings in the Rec Center this past year.

## ADULT BASIC EDUCATION

Dassel-Cokato Adult Basic Education (ABE) is a part of the Glacial Lakes Adult Basic Education Consortium made up of 10 local school districts. Students from Dassel-Cokato attend classes at the Litchfield or Hutchinson sites both online or in person.


