Our school will administer our Langston Student Survey sometime between March 26-April 4. The Langston Student Survey is completed by students in grades 2-5 and takes approximately 5 minutes. This survey is anonymous and provides our school staff with feedback on what students enjoy, and their concerns, and provides students an opportunity to give staff suggestions on how we can improve our school. At Langston, we value student opinions and want to hear their voices.

This is an Opt-In/Opt-Out tool. Only students whose parent/guardian has completed the opt-In form will be allowed to participate in completing the screener. Students may also opt out of the survey, even if the parent/guardian has opted in.

Other Important Items:

1. Participation is voluntary. Your child may decline to participate.
2. The survey will be completed using their iPad and answers will come in various forms such as Ratings, Short Answers, and Yes/No.
3. Participation is important. This data is extremely helpful in developing and modifying our school improvement goals.
