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# Hawks basketball has high hopes for Sections

Team hopes to stay strong after Conference

The Humboldt Hawks basketball team wrapped up their regular season last week. In their conference games they had an overall record of 3-9. They lost several very close games, while many of their wins were near blow-outs. For example, their game against Washington Tech, which they won 81-39.

Three OWL players played varsity this year, including 12th grader Danny Hobday, 11th grader Simon Casper and 10th grader Luke Hobday. Danny, one of the team's best defenders, also consistently gets rebounds along with his brother Luke. Simon is among the team's most developed shooters.

The players on the team aren't particularly happy with their conference record and hope to redeem themselves with a strong showing at the section tournament.

thus far, the culture of the basketball team stands strong. Simon explains the culture of the team as "loud, obnoxious people that make it fun to be around." This aspect of a basketball team keeps its bonds strong together. "The guys are super cool and make practices enjoyable," said Danny.

One of the most enjoyable parts of the season for the Hawks was the out of town tournament in Wilmar, MN. They had a record of 0-2 at the tournament but the two losses were both within 10 points. Despite not having the record they hoped for they still had a blast at the tournament. "It was fun to be able to spend time with teammates outside of school and practice," said Simon. Some of the activities they did was go swimming a lot and went bowling with the coaches and players.

On February 15 the Hawks played Roosevelt and had an impressive win over them 57-46. "Beating Minneapolis Roosevelt was the best win of the season. We proved to ourselves that we can beat teams that may be better on paper," said head coach Sam Esboldt. Last season they lost to them by 12 points, but the script flipped and the Hawks won by 11. This game showed the true potential of the team heading into the playoffs. While having an average offensive game they showed tremendous defense.

## Danny and Luke Hobday help Hawks with rebound acumen

Rebounding. One of the most underappreciated aspects of basketball. A team that consistently grabs the board after a missed shot is more likely to win. The last 12 years in the NBA, 8 championship winners have been in the top 15 in rebounding. The only team to be last in rebounding and win the championship is the 2012-2013 Miami Heat, who had LeBron.

The act of rebounding is grabbing the ball after a missed shot. The key aspects of being good at rebounding are height, jumping ability, hustle, and knowing when to jump. The leader in most rebounds ever in the NBA is Wilt Chamberlain, who was 7'1. But then there are guys like Charles Barkley at 19th and Dennis Rodman at 23 who are both under 6'7. They show the athletic part but, most importantly, the knowledge of when to jump while also having incredible hustle.

There are guys currently in the NBA, like Josh Hart, who's 6'4" but averages almost 10 rebounds a game. Hart plays every game like it's his last; he makes sure to leave everything on the floor. The Humboldt hawks have their own guys who show incredible rebounding and hustle.: Danny and Luke Hobday. Danny averages 4.3

rebounds per game; Danny is only 5'10, but has the best hustle on the team. He has 36 defensive rebounds and 46 offensive rebounds. Offensive rebounds are harder to get than defensive, because usually defensive players are closer to the rim and get better angles.

"Defensive rebounding is more of a team effort, you box out and if the ball flies into your hand you're lucky. That's why I don't get as many rebounds on the defensive end, on offense you go straight to the ball," said sophomore Luke Hobday. Luke is averaging 8.2 rebounds per game, which is 71st in Minnesota. For total rebounds, he has 188, which shoots him to top 30 in the state for total rebounds. He splits those boards into a crazy 86 offensive and 102 defensive. His 86 offensive rebounds is 12th in the state.

"Luke & Danny are two of our better rebounders because they want to be. They both have such great mindsets about going to the glass every single possession. I could not be happier to have the Hobday brothers in the program, they are a coach's dream," said head coach Sam Esboldt.

One key to rebounding is boxing out. Boxing out is when you use your body to seal off someone from getting

# **New METRO** Gold bus line

## The Bus Rapid Transit System will be a first for Minnesota

The new METRO Gold Line Bus Rapid Transit System service will begin on March 22nd, 2025. Metro Transit believes that the Gold Line will be a big step forward enhancing intercity connectivity throughout the Metro.

Gold Line is a 16-station route which generally runs just north of I-94. The Gold Line will run all day, daily for 10 miles, connecting Downtown Saint Paul, Maplewood, Landfall, Oakdale and Woodbury. It will run frequently during midday, evenings and Saturday; however, service will be less frequent in the early morning, late at night and on Sundays. The service will be adjusted based on demand after operation begins.

Around 70% of the Gold Line route will operate in busonly lanes; it is Minnesota's first Bus Rapid Transit(BRT) system to operate mostly in bus-only lanes.

A BRT is a bus-based transportation network focused on fast and efficient transportation. BRTs usually have features which enhance the speed and efficiency of the apparatus. The speed and efficiency of the Gold Line BRT is amplified by features which include: pre-boarding fare payment, NexTrip realtime departure and arrival times, fewer stops than local bus systems, raised platforms for easier boarding and exiting sequences and buses can request early or extended green lights using a software called Transit Signal Priority.

The Gold Line amenities and safety features include the option to pay using cash or credit, heated shelters, parking in four of the stations, bike racks, benches, energy-efficient LED station lighting, trash and recycling bins, security cameras and emergency telephones. The buses will be unique and feature wider aisles to accommodate wheelchairs and strollers.

The fares are the same as the METRO Light Rail, two dollars for adults; seniors, youth, Medicare card holders and disabled people are eligible for reduced fares during offpeak hours.

According Transit, roughly 14% of all households within half a mile of the Gold Line stations don't have cars and around 93,000 jobs are located within half a mile of the Gold Line stations. The Gold Line aims to strengthen the community's economy through providing transportation services in a job dense area.

"This project is [also] increasing connectivity throughout and access this corridor [with] new, improved and accessible trails, sidewalks and crossings for bicyclists, pedestrians and mobility device users," said Laura Baenen, Senior Communications Specialist and Public Relations for Metro Transit. "During the design and scoping of the project, we added upwards of \$20 million of above and beyond connections to stations for these accessible trail [and] pedestrian connections."

The project cost \$505.3 million which is less than a third of what light rail systems cost to build, per mile. The project was funded by the Federal Administration, which funded 45%; Ramsey County, which funded 26%; Washington County, which funded 26%; Counties Transit Improvement Board, which funded 1.5%; Federal Highway Administration, funded 1%; and the State of Minnesota, which funded 0.5%. Construction began in

"Built mostly adjacent and north of I-94, the project did not need to acquire any singlefamily homes for construction," said Baenen. "We worked closely with residents and small businesses to maintain access to their homes and businesses throughout construction. This included creating specific access and detour maps for businesses, community organizations and multi-family complexes for their patrons, residents and communities."

Before the project was transferred from the counties to Metro Transit for design and construction they formed two community committees to counsel the Gold Line. Once Metro Transit took over the project it formed another

## What is it and how can it be used? DAC auto systems have changed audio use throughout the years


What exactly is a DAC?

DAC is a short name for a digital to analog converter. A DAC is a device that changes digital audio signals into analog signals. Most devices nowadays have a built in DAC, whether that is your phone, gaming console, or laptop.

The issue with built in DACS is the fact that they can vary in quality that tend to only offer basic and not the best audio conversion; which can unfortunately lead to muffled or even a compressed like sound. External DACS on the other hand are made with higher quality internals and instead of making audio sound worse they can improve and preserve quality all while adding clarity, reducing distortion and minimizing data/signal loss.

DACS have been around

for a while, several decades at least at this point (invented in the 1980's). They originally played crucial roles in telecommunication even radio broadcasting. Telecommunication relied on DACS for converting digital signals into analog signals for clearer phone calls and radio transmissions and ironically enough radio stations relied

on DACS to stream higher phone, tablet or headphones fidelity sounds to the people who were listening.

How do DACS exactly work ?A DAC is an operating system that takes audio data signals that originally are in a binary code (a bunch of ones and zeros) and convert them into analog waveforms and instead of those ones and zeros being played through your

are now being streamed in that wave form. The DAC reads the binary codes and takes note of what khz the sample rate is producing at. The DAC also needs to actively reconstruct the ones and zeros that are more of a stair-like shape and blocky rather than a curve. The DAC takes the binary code and estimates the point between the other point of the blocks (using mathematical interpolation) from the original data and essentially fills in those gaps to make it an analog signal. This sequence of events also has to go through a reconstruction filter, which smooths out the signal, it can prevent distortion, help avoid unnecessary higher frequencies and further help the sound that is being reproduced sound

# ICE threatens sanctuary cities

## Trump administration's new policies may affect the Twin Cities

On February 5th the first planes of migrants landed at Guantanamo Bay. While we don't know the exact number of migrants on the planes, they were pictured in chains being led to the detainment facilities. This move by the Trump Administration plans to house 30,000 migrants at the site famous for its non-adherence to U.S law regarding detainees.

All across the country,

Immigration scenes of and Customs Enforcement (ICE) agents raiding homes, businesses, and government buildings to forcefully arrest undocumented migrants have increased since President Donald Trump's reelection. While these raids are publicized by the Trump administration as arresting violent offenders, NBC news found that of the nearly 1200 Undocumented

arrested on January 27th, only 613 were considered "criminal arrests" by ICE. The other 48% only committed the crime of entering the United States.

The majority of these "collateral are considered arrests," meaning in the process of a targeted raid on an undocumented migrant with a criminal record or charges. If someone else within the vicinity is found to also be undocumented, then that person is also arrested, and deported. While these raids have been touted by the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) as preventative measures, there is no evidence that undocumented migrants commit crimes at a higher rate than U.S-born citizens.

The Trump administration has furthered concerns over treatment of undocumented immigrants by removing government policies barring ICE agents from entering

schools, places of worship, and hospitals, among other sensitive locations. While no raids on public schools have occurred, Trump's new "Border Tzar", Tom Holman, has made it clear that anyone without proper documentation, is "on the table."

This threatens the over 11 million undocumented migrants, including roughly 850,000 children, that reside within the United States. DHS Secretary Kristi Noam also canceled an extension of Temporary Protected Status (TPS) for 600,000 Venezuelan migrants residing in The United States; many of them within the Twin Cities. This means after the April deadline, any Venezuelan with TPS could face deportation

These changes have worried many within the larger Twin Cities. Both St. Paul and Minneapolis are considered sanctuary cities, meaning that local law enforcement may not cooperate with ICE officials. This makes it more difficult for ICE to operate in these locations, but not impossible. As of now there have been no mass raids beyond what's typical within the Twin Cities, but many are on edge, as other cities such as Chicago and New York have faced mass raids.

There is no SPPS policy directly relating to ICE agents or other federal agents arresting, detaining, accessing the immigration status of students. Principal Dave Gundale said "if ICE came to an SPPS school, they would need to wait outside and the administrator would contact the school district Superintendent Office and General Council to determine next steps." There is also an SPPS policy that states "only representatives of the St. Paul

# Passports change gender options

## The Trump Administration has limited choices on US passports

What does this actually mean for our future?

This is a question many people probably have when they look at the executive decisions and presidential actions on the White House website. Within a week of his inauguration, President Donald Trump has made a plethora of decisions within the White House, leaving most Americans in the dust and trying to understand what this means for them. One that seemed to slip under people's radar is the new federal policy on gender, and, more specifically, how there are only two of them.

The basics of this official federal policy is that there are only two genders and two sexes: male and female. They are unchangeable, and "are grounded in fundamental and incontrovertible reality,"

as stated on whitehouse.gov. This policy specifically targets anyone who is non-binary, transgender, multi-gender, genderfluid, gender-neutral, or intersex.

Already, we are beginning to see changes in federal policies. A new passport and ID restriction was put in place, which does not allow for changes to gender on an identification. For the past few years, people have had three different options for what they could put as their sex on an ID: female, male, or X. "X" encompasses anyone who is outside of the female or male gender identity. For example, someone who is non-binary or intersex. You also had the option to change your sex from female to male or male to female.

But as of recently, with Trump's new executive order, those changes and accommodations will

longer be provided. After Trump's inauguration, all passport applications with any change to the sex, or requesting an "X," are denied and being held by the Department of State. If you are applying for a passport, a few weeks ago, you would have seen three options for gender on the passport. Now, you only have two. This is only the beginning of the targeting that trans and genderqueer people will face during the Trump presidency.

It is likely we will see a stark decline in gender-affirming care, to the point where all treatment may stop all together. Trump's administration has made it clear that they are focused mainly on children, and their protection from "radical gender ideology." This means that it is likely that the first form of gender affirming care they will target is pediatric. We are also likely to see the education around

orientation being purged from healthcare and schools. The CDC has recently taken down information about sexual orientation and gender care, in the wake of Trump's inauguration. The discrimination of trans and genderqueer people will also become significantly worse. It is already up in the air whether or not trans people will be allowed to serve in the U.S. army, and it is very likely any education about gender orientation will be muted in the coming months and years.

From here, it is tough to say how severe the mistreatment of those who do not fit the federal gender ideas will be. We can say some things for sure, such as how gender-affirming healthcare will be almost completely disabled, but how far things may escalate is still very much up in the air.

DACS are now found

in almost every device that produces sounds, such as phones, laptops and streaming devices in general. These systems all utilize DACS to process digital audio and the signals they produce. As mentioned before, internal DACS aren't always the best and tend to lack in quality, due to this external DACS are superior. External DACS come in many different forms, which can vary in connections and sizes. Some DACS are the size of your arm or portable and as small as an ipod. But the biggest (and my personal favorite) reason for DACS is that they have the ability to process and produce sound when it gets to the higher bit and sample rates/depths. When you try to change your settings on a streaming service to "Hi Res Lossless" you usually get a pop up asking/ suggesting "external hardware" to be able to fully experience the higher resolution. With said external hardware you would be able to process and experience 24-bit/96kHz or even 32-bit/192kHz, on my last story this part was not very

emphasised but streaming music on airpods or bluetooth in general will not be able to handle and reproduce that music to it's full potential due to missing that external hardware. Using a DAC can allow for higher resolution and a more detailed experience, and you can use them in a variety of aspects, such as speakers, home and car setups or wired headphones.

This is all in the name and faith of achieving higher sound quality, but is it worth it? It does always depend on who you ask, people have different priorities and to some people their music listening experience is fine as it is. The point of having and utilizing DACS is to get more than fine or then what is coming out of your phone laptop etc. If you are then it's probably not worth it, could even be a waste of time or "too much work". To those who pay more attention to their music and are interested in higher resolution music then I would say it's worth it. Hearing different aspects and unheard elements of a song can make it a more fun and immersive experience. It can make you appreciate the songs a lot more due to realizing how truly complex they are.

committee and held in-person and virtual open houses and events at community festivals to hear public input, said Baenen. "Community engagement continued throughout construction of the project, especially with door-knocking, canvassing and neighborhood meetings to meet people where they are, in-person."

After hearing complaints about the Route 94 express bus service in late 2024 the Metropolitan Council decided to replace the express bus service from Downtown St. Paul to Downtown Minneapolis with Gold Line service by expanding the Gold Line to include Minneapolis in 2027.

The extension will cost \$15-20 million which will be covered by the Metropolitan Council's existing capital budget. It will use the current BRT and express bus stops along the extension corridor along with some new stations. Express bus stops will be upgraded for Gold Line buses.

The Green Line also connects St. Paul and Minneapolis. The trip takes an average of 40-50 minutes on weekdays. The Gold Line extension is expected to make the trip in 15 minutes.

The full Gold Line route will bring people all the way from Woodbury to the Minneapolis Farmers Market.

"Extending the Gold Line will create a true crosstown route that allows people to travel efficiently between the east metro and some of our region's top destinations," said Lesley Kandaras, Metro Transit General Manager.



# book review

Akata Witch deals with serious topics, while having a fun tone

I did not intend on reading Akata Witch the first time I was introduced to it. It was handed out in class as it's this year's Read Brave novel, and it sat pretty much untouched on my bedroom floor for a week. And now, after reading it, I will say that it was absolutely worth it. The novel brings out my nostalgia for secret-world fantasy novels that I read in my childhood like the Harry Potter or Percy Jackson books, while bringing forth real world issues in a way which both younger audiences would be able to understand and older

audiences can appreciate.

Akata Witch, written by award winning author Nnedi Okorafor and published in 2011, is the first novel in the Nsibidi Scripts book series. The novel takes place in Nigeria and it follows the path of the main character, Sunny Nwazue. Sunny is a 12 year old born in the U.S. to Nigerian parents, before moving Nigeria when she was nine. As if Sunny didn't feel isolated enough from her split heritage, neither fully Nigerian nor fully American, she was born albino. Sunny's 'friends,' often make fun of her behind her back, calling her akata, a derogatory slur in Nigeria for Black Americans, as well as ghost girl.

After getting into a confrontation with her former friends, Orlu, a boy in her class, walks her home, and together they realize how much they have in common. Orlu introduces her to Chichi; a sharp-tongued girl who isn't afraid to speak her mind. For the first time in a long time, Sunny has friends; she feels normal. One day, Orlu has somewhere to be after school and can't walk home with Sunny. Now alone, Chichi approaches her and tells her that Sunny should know the

full story.

After a cryptic conversation with Chichi, where she talks about Orlu's ability to "undo" things, Sunny is left grasping for answers neither of her friends are willing to give her. That is, until Orlu draws a symbol of chalk on the cover of a book and pulls out a knife the size of his hand and forces her to swear secrecy to everything he will tell her. There, Orlu pulls her into an entire new world, one of juju and magical Leopard societies. Together with her friends, she needs to learn to navigate a whole new world where everything she once knew now holds no ground. And once she is just barely able to begin understanding this world, Sunny and her group of friends are called upon by a council of scholars to help take down a magical serial killer.

Despite my hesitancy to pick up the novel, the book is certainly worth the read. Okorafor excels in keeping her writing engaging. Every moment of the novel is relevant, and she never dwells on anything for very long (unlike some famous fantasy writers). No disrespect towards the classics, but it is certainly welcome when a writer moves the plot along succinctly. Perhaps I've been reading too much classic literature, but a straight-to-the-point novel like Akata Witch is a welcome breath of fresh air. This does result in less direct imagery, as Okorafor doesn't go into excruciating detail of the setting, so for those who enjoy more descriptive novels, this may be a turn-away from the

## Despite their problems, SPPS-issued devices serve their purpose

Each Saint Paul Public Schools student is issued an iPad for school work. I became interested in whether these were the best devices for this purpose and decided to look at the pros and cons of these iPads, and compare them against some other devices.

One of the most important traits of a school issued device is its durability. They need to be able to withstand careless and clumsy treatment, while still being usable. The school issued iPads accomplish this by using a case, which while not necessarily a core part of the iPad, is not available on alternative solutions like laptops. The cases allow iPads to withstand significant amounts of abuse, while

remaining intact.

These cases also give the iPads a stand and keyboard giving them a more laptoplike form. Even the keyboards are more durable than a more traditional one, which while not feeling as nice to type on, allows for it to withstand spills and grime that ends up on it, and better protects the keys from removal. However because the keyboard is designed as a single piece, any damage to the keyboard will affect most keys.

But even if the iPads do break, they are available in mass quantities for cheap, meaning it's not a big deal to have them replaced by the school. I have estimated that they cost somewhere around \$450 each.

Another aspect of the iPads is their size, with a total screen size of 10.2 inches diagonally, which can be both a positive and a negative. Its smaller size makes it more portable which is essential for a school device which needs to fit inside backpacks and be easily carried around, but at the same time the smaller screen gives less room for the actual

the school issued iPads are not a full replacement for a laptop. Notably they do not have a mouse (or something similar like a touchpad), in favor of a touchscreen. solution would be laptops with touchscreens, which are relatively common and available even on low end

It also encourages the use of the mobile app versions of programs like Google Sheets which are vastly inferior to their web-based counterparts. Even for less complex programs than Google Sheets, like Google Docs, and Schoology, their web versions are more advanced and have more features. Sometimes, like in the case of Google Sheets and Schoology, you can still access the web version through the browser, but it may not function as intended and is jankier, especially if the site expects you to have a mouse.

Every school year only allows for eight issues of the purple press to go out, which in turn means only eight chances for me to review my favorite books, which of course isn't nearly enough time for all the books I'd like to talk about. As a result, rather than writing one review per issue, I've decided to quickly run through many of my biggest YA book recommendations from the fantasy and sci-fi genres. A small fleet of survivors narrowly escape the initial assault, but out in space, their problems just don't seem to end - not only is a BeiTech warship pursuing them, but the fleet's AI seems to have gone insane, and a dangerous virus is breaking out on one of the ships. As everything comes to a head, Kady and Ezra may be forced to take the lead when the ships' captains could not.

On its own, Illuminae is a pretty solid book, but the presentation is what really makes it stand out. Rather than a traditional book, the story is presented through a collection of documents - interview surveillance transcripts, footage summaries, chat logs, and many artistic pages in which words flow into images. All of this combines into a book whose reading experience is like no other I've ever experienced.

I do need to put in a bit of a content warning here - as with many space operas dealing with fighting spaceships and explosions, there is a lot of death in this book, and the unique format of the story really forces you to feel each and every one, much more so than any other book, so note that if you're not comfortable with that, this book may not be for you.

This next pick could also count as a space opera (I may have cheated a bit), but I feel it's different enough that it can

count for its own category. My pick for a more episodic, sliceof-life sci-fi story is The Long Way To A Small Angry Planet by Becky Chambers. On December 9th, 2023 Ncuti Gatwa (n-shoo-tee gaht-wah) made his debut in Doctor Who as the 15th Doctor, following a biregeneration (when the Doctor regenerates into two separate Doctors) with David Tennant's fourteenth Doctor.

The 15th Doctor is the first black Doctor in the history of Doctor Who. Since his debut, he has starred in eight episodes and two specials. For the first time, these episodes are airing on Disney+, though previous Doctor Who episodes can be found on HBO Max.

Doctor Who is a sci-fi television series on BBC. It began in 1963 but ended in 1989, before a movie in 1996, and the series' eventual revival in 2005. It went on a short hiatus in 2022, before returning in 2023 for Ncuti Gatwa's Doctor. The show

# What happened to Overwatch?

## How the game went from millions of players to just under 17,000

You probably haven't heard the name Overwatch in a long time- and if you have, you probably haven't heard it in good contexts. Nowadays, the game is known for its blatant anti-player structuring, poor balancing, poor game design decisions, and excessive monetization. These factors have effectively killed the game, reaching its lowest ever player count in December 2024 with just a little under 17,000 players active. How did this game, once championed

Overwatch was initially announced by Blizzard, the studio behind MMO sensations StarCraft, World of Warcraft, and Hearthstone, at their convention, BlizzCon, in November of 2014. Minutes

as the pinnacle of eSports and

pulling in millions of active

players, fall this far from grace?

after it was announced, attendees of the event were granted access to a demo of the game, with 14 unique characters available in a 6v6 showdown, drawing inspiration from other hero shooters such as Team Fortress 2. Audiences raved about the smooth, quick gameplay and hero design, kickstarting Overwatch's extensive marketing campaign, which lasted for about a year. In the days leading up to the game's highly anticipated release, Blizzard announced a 4-day beta testing period, which allowed players to test out the game for free (as long as the player was registered with Battle.net, Blizzard's game client). This beta pulled in almost 9.7 million players, which defied the expectations of both critics and Blizzard themselves. Overwatch finally released in May 2016, selling more than 7 million copies in

Upon release, Overwatch players racked up over 110 million hours of gameplay in its first week from all 7 million players. It wasn't long before small-scale eSports events cropped up, where skilled players would face each other for a small cash prize. As Overwatch's eSports scene gained traction, Blizzard saw a means to organize an official league, called Overwatch League. Similarly to football, basketball, or baseball, teams were established in cities in countries such as South Korea, the U.S., Canada, and China, and backed by sponsors. Players would be signed from all across the world and pitted against each other in regular season and playoff games, eventually culminating in a championship at the end of the season. This setup was revolutionary in the eSports scene, because it was treated 6.

more like an organized sport than the typical eSports format of semi-organized leagues of small, non-sponsored teams.

Overwatch League was a success, attracting almost half a million viewers in its first game, and making almost four times the revenue critics and experts expected. The league continued to thrive throughout the following years, signing deals with Disney, T-mobile, Spotify, Coca-Cola, and more. Also a success was the Overwatch World Cup, which worked similarly to soccer's World Cup; players of the same nationality would annually come together to compete for their National Team against other national teams. The 2017 OWC final in Anaheim had over 300,000 viewers, with South Korea emerging as the champion.

As of January 16, 2025, the Nintendo Switch 2 has been officially announced by Nintendo, along with a teaser for a new Mario Kart game, where it was shown on screen in the trailer. The announcement revealed other important details like backwards compatibility so you can play a lot of your old switch games on your new console. They also announced an overview trailer on April 2, 2025 discussing further details and events around the world showcasing the console.

After the reveal, many gaming journalists were very confused and worried about Nintendo's future, because they felt that the new console didn't do enough to separate itself from the original console. They had many complaints such as it looking too similar to the original, the name may cause people to not buy it because they think they already have a Nintendo Switch and don't need a new one, and the magnetic holder for the controllers looking breakable and flimsy.

Although the price has not been confirmed you can expect it to be in between \$400-450 based on the previous Switch's price, which was \$300 at launch. This has upset people because journalists think that the average person won't want to buy this new console if they already have a Switch, especially if it's way more expensive and doesn't look that different. They don't know the technical upgrades that are happening on this new console and are worried because of what happened with the previous console, the Wii U.

What happened there was that Nintendo was not able to market the console as something distinct from the original Wii and people didn't buy it. It still goes on as one of the worst selling Nintendo consoles of all time. But the difference between these two scenarios is the Wii U didn't have any game titles that sold on the console, whereas the new Switch 2 has an opportunity to have console selling titles and that could push the sales up.

Besides the new Mario Kart, no other game has been officially announced by Nintendo. But many games are expected to eventually be released, including new 2D and 3D Mario games, along with other games that have been announced for the current switch, like Metroid Prime 4. Whether these will be available on day one of release is up to speculation.

As of late, a lot of Nintendo games are reportedly being ported to the PS5 by a studio called Panic Button, which has done a lot of porting for old Nintendo Switch games, so it is possible to think that these games could also come to the new system, but this is also pure speculation.

The video game industry is changing. It's been eight years, almost a decade, since the first Switch, and people are ready for a new generation and want new games. But this is not the same planet it was eight years ago, so they need to treat it like that. They need to separate themselves from the first Switch generation, but keep the name and branding, so they have quite a puzzle to

# Knocked Loose is short yet unique In 10 tracks, album cleverly combines loud vocals and dark tones

This is probably the angriest album I've heard, at least for a while. The hardcore punk/ metalcore album, You Won't Go Before You're Supposed To by Knocked Loose, was released on May 10th, 2024. It's loud, angry, somehow groovy, and has many heavy, slow breakdowns. Breakdowns are moments usually in the latter half of a song and it's typically when the song gets super heavy and chunky. There always seems to be a sort of creepy or uneasy feeling in each song.

#### Overwatch, 6

flourish until March of 2018, when a support character (a character with abilities to heal damage taken by teammates) named Brigette was added. Players immediately noticed her extremely powerful set of abilities, with automatic and powerful healing, heavily damaging abilities (which are not common in support characters), and her ability to stun opponents, leaving them unable to move or use abilities. She quickly found her way into competitive and OWL team compositions, becoming a staple of the GOATS team composition (which consisted of three tank characters and three support characters). GOATS proved extremely difficult to counter, dominating Overwatch's competitive scene and angering thousands of players, causing some players to take hiatuses or completely

drop the game. To deal with this, Blizzard implemented the controversial feature of a role queue, which forced you to predetermine your role (e.g. tank, damage dealer, support) before entering a game. This alienated players, semieffectively fixing the GOATS issue but restricting the player's ability to create imaginative team compositions with a mix of roles.

Facing dropping player counts and growing negative public opinions of the game, in 2019 Blizzard made the surprise announcement of Overwatch 2, a reboot of the game that included an extensive single-player story mode, new game modes, and an incredible cinematic announcement trailer. Hype around Overwatch 2 slowly began to grow after the announcement trailer, but due to most Blizzard developers working on Overwatch 2, the original Overwatch received little significant updates, causing even more players to drop the game. By the time Overwatch 2 was released in 2022, the player count of Overwatch 1had reached historic lows. Overwatch 2 released for free on every modern platform, and millions of players new and old, booted up the game to see what had changed.

Immediately noticed were the obvious changes to the game's monetization, scrapping the constant free cosmetics that Overwatch 1 would reward you with via loot boxes and replacing it with a virtual currency similar to Fortnite's V-buck system. This system is commonplace in most live service video games as of the last couple of years, and wouldn't cause as much of an uproar if not for the fact the tokens were egregiously overpriced, costing you almost \$20 for a single skin. Not only this, the game is first person, so you wouldn't even get to see the skin you paid \$20 for during 95% of gameplay. This quickly began negative backlash to Overwatch 2's release, as players felt the game was now a blatant cash grab. Also noticed were the changes to gameplay, like how the number of players on a team went from 6 to 5, drastically decreasing the amount of interesting and creative team compositions you could create.

These issues, along with a slew of other more minor issues, quickly turned many players off from the game, and it lost popularity quickly. Many players still held out hope for Overwatch 2, hoping that the single-player mode would prove to be worth all of these alienating changes. Unfortunately, delay after delay kept the single-player away from players, and in

2023, Blizzard blindsided the entire player base by canceling the single-player mode entirely and releasing a poorly-made PvE mode that was pathetically boring and repetitive. In another blindside, they also claimed to have canceled the single-player before Overwatch 2 even released, leaving thousands of players feeling betrayed and

Player count on Overwatch 2 dropped even further after the cancellation of the singleplayer, reaching all-time lows in late 2023- and with dwindling profits and lack of interest in the game, Blizzard shut down the Overwatch League in early 2024, killing the game's competitive scene and effectively digging its own grave. In 2024, Overwatch 2 faced impressively low player counts, despite constant collaborations and events to attempt to bring back players.

Even worse for Overwatch 2, NetEase's Marvel Rivals released in late 2024, which is a game very fundamentally similar to Overwatch but featuring Marvel superheroes, which snatched away even more of Overwatch 2's players. Soon, Overwatch 2 reached its lowest player count ever, with just a little under 17,000 players active.

Once a flourishing eSports giant and a reputable hero shooter, now a dying cash cow that Blizzard is attempting and failing to milk every last drop out of. Overwatch's story has gone down in history as one of the furthest falls from grace in online gaming history. In my opinion, it's truly a shame what happened to Overwatch; but at least it can be a cautionary tale for any other online game trying to get its feet off the ground.



the rebounds on offense or defense.


