Dear Parent/Guardian:

I hope the school year is off to a successful start for you and your child. I am writing this letter to let you know that <u>Simkins Elementary School</u> has been designated as a Targeted Support & Improvement Additional Targeted Support (TSI-AT) school by the North Carolina State Board of Education. Per ESSA Section 1111(d)(2), schools are identified as TSI-AT schools in North Carolina because one or more of the following subgroups received a subgroup performance grade score at or below the highest identified CSI-LP school's All Students group during the identification year; and is on the TSI-CU list for the subgroup(s) for the previous year. Subgroup performance scores are provided for the following subgroups: (1) Students with Disabilities, (2) Economically Disadvantaged, (3) Black, (4) White, (5) Hispanic, (6) Asian-Pacific Islander, (7) Multi-racial, and (8) English Learners. This letter is to notify our parents and guardians of <u>Simkins' students</u> intentions to improve educational outcomes for underperforming student subgroups and close achievement gaps for all students.

As a TSI-AT (ATSI) school, <u>Simkins Elementary School</u> is required to develop an Additional Targeted Support and Improvement (ATSI) plan that specifically addresses how the school will improve outcomes for underperforming subgroups. The plan will also include strategies that our district or charter will employ to support <u>Simkins'</u> improvement efforts. The ATSI plan will address the following areas:

- Classroom Management
- Instructional Leadership
- Recruitment & Retention of Effective Teachers
- Implementation of a Tiered Instructional System

We have set the following goals for *Simkins Elementary School* this year:

By June 30, 2025, Simkins Elementary will increase its overall Performance Composite by at least 3 percentage points, from 32.7% to 36%.

By June 2025, Simkins Elementary school will reduce the number of chronic absences from 31% to 25%. This includes reducing the number of Tier 3 attendance students to less than 40.

By June 2025, Simkins Elementary school faculty will increase teacher capacity in literacy instruction by ensuring 100% completion of district and state required licensure requirements.

By June 2025, Simkins Elementary will implement a tiered instructional system that allows teachers to deliver evidence-based instruction designed with the individual needs of students across all tiers.



Here are some strategies that we will be implementing to improve student outcomes:
