- ☐ Start/Continue to build your college application list
- ☐ List at least 3-5 schools that you intend on applying to.
  - ➤ 1 REACH school (a school that you would love to attend, but not sure about... go for it!)
  - ➤ 2 FAVORITE Schools (schools that you feel very confident about, and schools that you would like to attend)
  - ➤ 1 BACKUP School (this school may not be your top choice, but you know you will get accepted!
- ☐ Do your REASEARCH!
  - Create a CFNC account, if you do not have one (<u>www.cfnc.org</u>)
  - ➢ Be sure you review the entrance requirements. You all should be good with any requirements. Just check for schools that may have updated requirements, for example, 3 levels of a foreign language. If you notice this for any of your school choices, please let me know ASAP, so that we can discuss.
  - Access <u>Big Future</u> via CFNC to assist you with narrowing down your colleges, and making wise decisions for where to apply. (<a href="https://bigfuture.collegeboard.org/">https://bigfuture.collegeboard.org/</a>)
  - ➤ PLAN COLLEGE VISITS!!!
- ☐ Common Application- Go ahead and create/log into your account. You can add school that you are interested in, and go ahead and view essay prompts.
- ☐ Start creating an outline for your essays.
- ☐ Start writing your <u>essays</u>, and have several people read, review, and correct your essays.
  - Remember essays should be genuine, personal, and real. Write from experience, be as transparent as you feel comfortable with. Essays, and letter of recommendation are often deciding factors between students who may have the same great grades.
- ☐ On that note, make a list of teachers, community members, etc who you can ask for a <u>letter of recommendation</u>. The sooner you request this the better. If you wait too late, many of these people will be bombarded with numerous request, and you may end up with a generic letter of recommendation, which could not be helpful for you.
