Prior Park Schools is a family of Christian schools based in Bath and Gibraltar. Together, the Schools offer education for pupils aged between 3 and 18. Since the establishment of Prior Park College in 1830, the family has grown, with The Paragon School joining in 2006, and Prior Park School Gibraltar being opened by Prior Park Schools in 2016.

The Schools' Mission is to steward a thriving family of communities with love for the young people they serve at their heart. These vibrant communities cultivate creativity, foster integrity, and transform lives.

Across three sites, the Schools educate over 1100 young people of all faiths and none. The values underpinning the Mission and the Schools' educational offerings are Curiosity, Generosity, and Courage. The Schools believe that quality education changes lives and that outstanding schools are engines for positive social transformation.

Our Schools provide excellent teaching, equipping our young people to leave for a variety of exciting destinations. The Department

The science department at Prior Park is a well resourced faculty that aims to instil in students a love of science while developing their sense of wonder. Our goal is to develop young people into informed, scientifically literate members of society. We try to look beyond the limits of exam specifications to give our students the skills needed to critically assess information, identify patterns and relationships and to collaborate successfully with others both in the lab and in the wider community. The department currently comprises 9 teachers.

The average set sizes are:

KS3 - 22 Students

KS4 - 18 Students

KS5 - 7 Students

Curriculum and Results

Science is compulsory for all students in KS3 and KS4, with the latter being given the option to study separate sciences for the GCSE. AQA is the exam board at GCSE and A Level, with the exception of Physics A level which is OCR. Our year 7 curriculum is based on science skills with scientific investigations being the main focus. Students begin studying the GCSE curriculum in year 9.

KS3 sets are mixed ability whilst at KS4 there are three sets; one of which comprises students who have chosen separate sciences, with the other two being set by ability.

Resources and Accommodation

The department has four laboratories, three of which contain a fume cupboard. All laboratories contain the equipment that you would expect to find to run typical practical activities in a UK secondary school. There is one lab technician in the departments to manage experiment requests.

A wide variety of online services are also available to students to allow them to further their learning beyond the four walls of the classroom. Teachers utilise Microsoft 365 software, in particular Microsoft OneNote in the delivery of all lessons, and in the monitoring and tracking pupil progress. All students in the department bring personal learning devices to lessons and use this as their normal way of working. Additionally, all teaching staff are issued with Lenovo ThinkPad Yoga devices, with digital pens, to help with their teaching. Prior Park Schools use Office 365 as our learning platform and all teaching staff are expected to have, or be working towards, the Microsoft Innovative Educator award. At present, we use OneNote and Teams as our main learning tools with other Office 365 apps as required e.g. Word, PowerPoint and Excel.

Extra-Curricular Activities and Trips

We believe that it is vital to promote interest and enthusiasm for the subject beyond the constraints of the specifications, to engender intellectual curiosity and to develop the capacity for independent thought.

Recent trips included the local wildlife park and botanic gardens, the water reservoirs, the radar facility in the Port Authority, as well as trips that take advantage of our unique location such as a boat trip to see the dolphins or marine invertebrates interaction at the local beach.

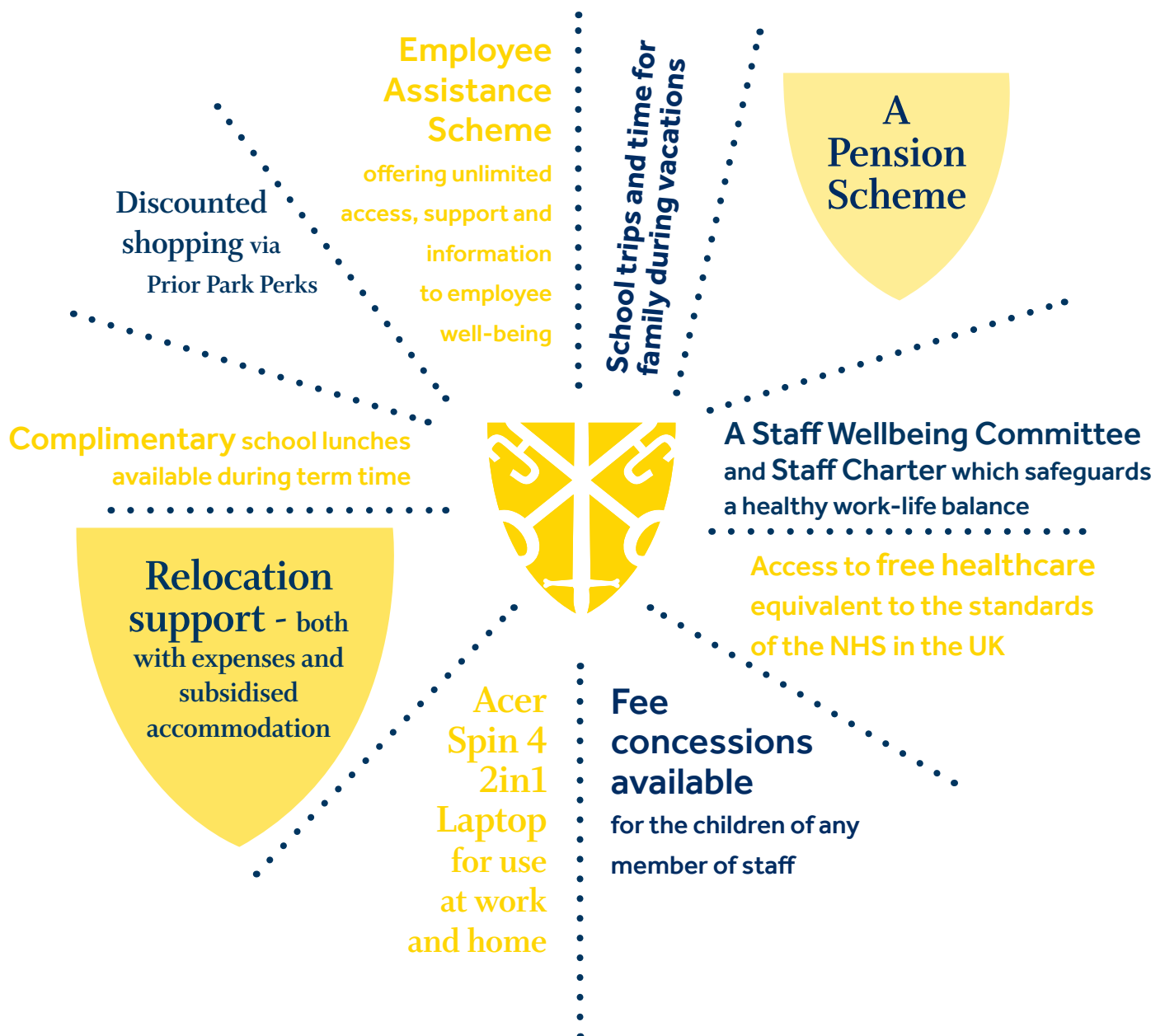
- To contribute to the extra-curricular programme of the school, which may include evenings and weekends
