ARKANSAS' DEMAND OCCUPATIONS Doctoral or professional degree (D) - Requires at least three years of full-time academic study beyond a bachelor's degree. Some college, no degree (SC) - Requires the completion of a high school diploma or equivalent plus the completion of one or more postsecondary courses that did not result in a degree or award.

HOT 45 Bachelor's degree (B) - Requires four or five years of full-time academic study.

Associate degree (A) - Requires at least two years of full-time academic study.

Postsecondary non-degree award (PS) - Programs last a few weeks to more than a year, leads to a certificate or other award.

High School diploma or equivalent (HS) - Requires the completion of high school or equivalent program resulting in the award of a high school diploma or an equivalent, such as a GED.

No Formal Education (NFE) - Signifies that a formal credential issued by an educational institution, such as a high school diploma or postsecondary certificate, is not typically needed for entry into the occupation.
