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OVSD's Consideration of a New Board Election System

The Ocean View School District (OVSD) has been exploring a potential transition in the way Board Members are elected. Currently, our District follows an at-large election system, where all voters within OVSD boundaries can vote for all five Board Members. However, a shift to a by-trustee area election system is being considered. Under this new approach, voters would elect one Trustee who resides within the same designated geographic area as the voter.

While this change would alter how Board Members are elected, it is important to emphasize that it will not impact:

- School boundaries
- School services, programs, and resources
- Full Board representation of each and every student
- OVSD's commitment to providing educational excellence

At the January 28 and February 25 OVSD Board of Trustees' meetings, the Board held public hearings to gather community input on how the trustee area maps should be drawn.

The first draft of trustee area maps will be provided during the March 25 Board of Trustees' meeting and will include a public hearing. In response to the input provided, the maps will be revised and presented at the April 8 Board Meeting for the second public hearing, with the anticipated third public hearing and approval during the May 13 Board Meeting.

We greatly appreciate the participation and feedback from our community throughout this process. Engaging with families, staff, and stakeholders is a vital part of ensuring a fair and representative election system for OVSD. For more information, visit <u>www.ovsd.org</u>.





This event marked the culmination of a year-long collaboration between our district and UCLA's Spark Reach program, a partnership that has empowered students to develop creative solutions addressing realworld challenges.

Throughout the year, students engaged in dynamic learning experiences, exploring STEM careers, social entrepreneurship, and the design-thinking process. Under the guidance of Spark Reach mentors, students followed an iterative approach—defining challenges, brainstorming ideas, designing and prototyping solutions, gathering feedback, and refining their inventions. Their work has spanned critical topics such as ocean conservation, renewable energy, sustainable cities, and technological advancements tied to the 2028 Olympics in Los Angeles.

The Symposium highlighted the incredible projects that students have been working on, showcasing their ingenuity and ability to tackle pressing global issues. Attendees witnessed firsthand how students have applied their skills in engineering, robotics, and entrepreneurship to create impactful solutions. Many of these young innovators have even competed in national pitch competitions, demonstrating their ability to turn ideas into actionable change. Nearly all students reported gaining a deeper understanding of social entrepreneurship and how to innovate with a purpose. This event is a testament to their hard work and dedication.

Celebrating 50 Years of Inside the Outdoors: A Legacy of Learning and Renewal

For five decades, Inside the Outdoors has served as a gateway to discovery, inspiring generations of students to connect with the natural world in meaningful ways.

Since its inception in 1974, this Orange County Department of Education program has provided immersive outdoor experiences to more than 3.5 million students, bringing science to life in ways that textbooks cannot. It all began with the first Outdoor Science

School, which gave students the chance to step beyond classroom walls and into nature. In 1981, the program expanded to include day programs at other picturesque sites throughout Orange County, ensuring even more students could take part in hands-on environmental learning.

For many young learners, today's Inside the Outdoors program represents a first encounter with nature — one that sparks curiosity, encourages exploration and instills a sense of environmental stewardship. In fact, research consistently shows that outdoor education increases student engagement, strengthens academic achievement and promotes social-emotional well-being while deepening appreciation for the environment.

This year, we celebrate not only the program's 50-year history but also its impact and resilience.

In December 2020, tragedy struck when a fast-moving wildfire swept through Rancho Soñado, which had long served as ITO's headquarters. Along with destroying the caretakers' home, the fire claimed the lives of many of the animals that had been part of the program's educational experiences. It was a heartbreaking loss for our Inside the Outdoors family and for the many students and educators who had formed lasting connections with the site.

Yet, that loss has strengthened our resolve to provide these kinds of opportunities. We are now actively working to redevelop Rancho Soñado with a vision that honors its natural beauty while enhancing its role as an immersive outdoor learning space. Our goal is not just to rebuild, but to thoughtfully restore and reimagine the site, ensuring future generations can take in the sights, sounds and lessons of nature in Orange County's own backyard.




