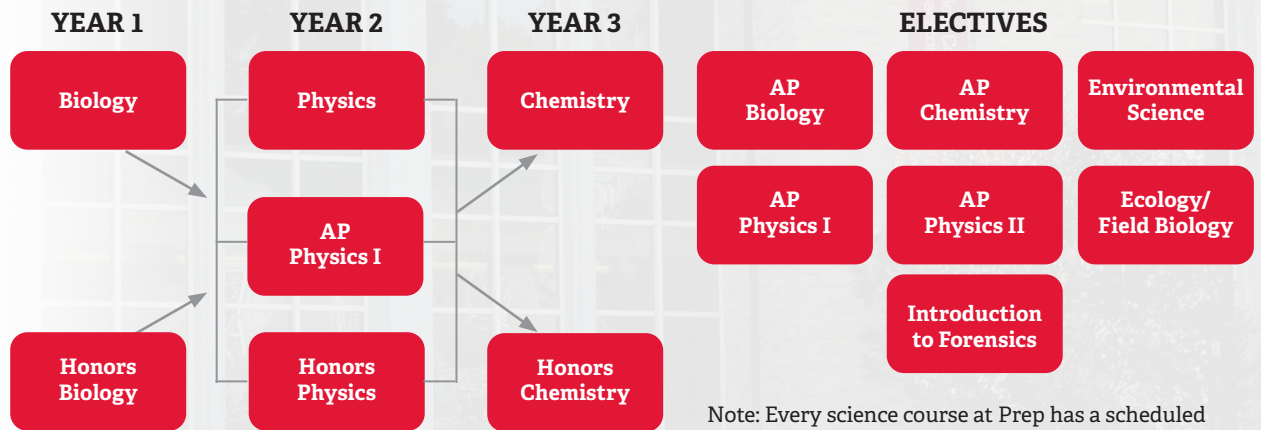


Summer Pre-Calculus is offered to eligible **juniors** who have completed Honors Algebra II as a prerequisite for Calculus or AP Calculus AB. Summer Geometry is offered to eligible **freshmen** who have completed Algebra I as a prerequisite for Honors Algebra II or Algebra II. Students who complete AP Calculus BC as juniors will enroll in Multivariable Calculus, AP Statistics or Linear Algebra as seniors.

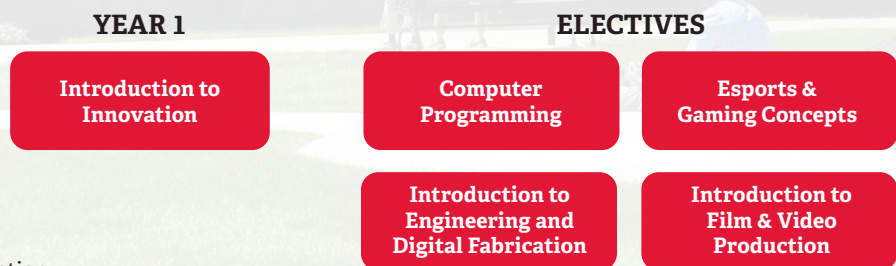
