SBCEO Supporting SEL in 2024-2025



15,210 Students

Will have experienced chant rallies, mindfulness residencies, and artistic performances teaching self-affirmation, words of kindness, and resiliency, with follow up resources for teachers to continue once the performers leave.

Will have received professional development through workshops and site-based ongoing coaching, and custom work plans, including alternative schools for Lompoc, SB Unified, SY Valley, SBCEO.

300+ Educators

50 Campus Safety Staff

Will have received professional development on **de-escalation practices and restorative approaches** for when students are experiencing dysregulation.

Site leadership teams will have participated in workshops designed to align SEL and MTSS across their site, and sometimes across their feeder pattern.

MWEL - Partnership between SBCEO and BWELL

Grant Overview

- 5 Million funded by State of CA Mental Health Student Services Act
- SBCEO is subcontractor to BWELL but entities share full partnership in decision making and direction
- Began October 2020 with contract ending 2026
- Exploring sustainability post contract such as billing options and additional grants



Goals and Outcomes

- Prevention Focus to support mental health in participating school districts
- Provide education to increase awareness, reduce stigma and recognize needs
- Improve timely access to services to prevent severe and disabling mental illness
- Prevent negative outcomes in special populations




