CONTRACT FOR HEALTH AND WELFARE SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT made in duplicate this 24th day of February 2025, by and between the Board of Education of the Batavia City School District and the Board of Education of the Wyoming Central School District

WHEREAS, the District is empowered under Education Law section 912 to enter into a contract with the Batavia City School District for the purpose of having the Batavia City School District provide health and welfare services for children who are residents of the District and who attend non-public schools located in the Batavia City School District during the period from September 1, 2024 through June 30, 2025.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

1. The District shall provide Resident Students with health and welfare services. Such health and welfare services shall include, but are not limited to: services performed by a physician, dentist, dental hygienist, nurse, school psychologist, school social worker or school speech pathologist, and may also include dental prophylaxis, vision and hearing tests, the maintenance of cumulative health records and the administration of emergency care programs for ill or injured pupils.
2. The Batavia City School District shall provide to Resident Students who attend the Non-Public Schools the health and welfare services which the Batavia City School District provides the students who attend its schools. The Batavia City School District shall also furnish the following equipment to be used in providing such services if requested by the authorities in charge of the Non-Public Schools: supplies and equipment for use by a physician, school nurse-teacher, psychologist, dental hygienist, social worker, and speech pathologist (i.e., scales, vision and hearing testing devices, health record forms, first aid supplies, and all other readily transportable equipment and supplies pertaining to the delivery of services).
3. It is expressly agreed by and between the parties that the services agreed to be provided by the Batavia City School District under the terms of this agreement shall not include any teaching service.

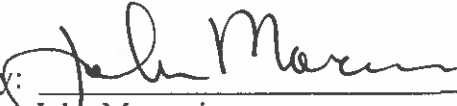

RESOLUTION OF BOARD OF EDUCATION

WHEREAS, four (4) BOCES (Onondaga-Cortland-Madison BOCES, Albany-Schoharie-Schenectady-Saratoga BOCES, Madison-Oneida BOCES and Broome-Tioga BOCES) have collaborated and entered into an Article 5 General Municipal Law intermunicipal arrangement for the purpose of improving vendor management and data security and privacy practices for school districts and/or BOCES statewide known as the RIC ONE Risk Operations Center (the "ROC");

"WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the _____, through its affiliation with a locally based Regional Information Center, participates with the ROC and desires, for the 2024-2025 fiscal year, to authorize the ROC to enter into Data Privacy Agreements and related exhibits (DPAs) with vendors and third-party contractors that include the requirements of, and compliance with, New York State Education Law Section 2-d and Part 121 Regulations (collectively, "Ed Law 2d") related to student personally identifiable information (PII) and certain Teacher and Principal APPR data;"

WHEREAS, the ROC also partners with NYSED, the Access4Learning Student Data Privacy Consortium (SDPC) and The Education Cooperative (TEC), to negotiate and approve Ed Law 2-d compliant DPAs;

WHEREAS, the DPAs are presented to school districts and/or BOCES for final execution and do not require the expenditure of funds beyond those budgeted; and

BE IT RESOLVED, Board of Education of the _____ authorizes the attorneys designated by the ROC to negotiate and approve of DPAs for software and/or technology resources; and,
