## <u>Information Item: Public Comment (Brandau)</u>

### Information Item: Superintendents Council (Naik)

- Staffing challenges have driven delays in project approvals and contract issues. The district expects things to get better.
- There has been a transition of two STEM schools to magnet schools.

#### Information Item: Superintendents Council (Margeson)

- Margeson's goal in her role is to coordinate all the news and propagate it through the various social channels to drive transparency in the community.
- The challenge today is not all information is getting shared, so the SGC will work to ensure information is funneled through Mrs Margeson.

#### Information Item: Charter Dollar Expenditure; Strategic Plan Update; Principal's Update; (Scheifflee)

• Current staffing: A new football coach (Coach Landis) has been hired. Coach Landis has recruited five additional coaches, including Ron Jankiv, for weight training.

- Budget: Timelines have moved. Staffing allocations have been shifted to the 21<sup>st</sup>. The budget will be closed on March 14 (vs. March 7). The budget's approval is now due on March 24.
- Student Engagement: This was the final meeting for rising 9<sup>th</sup>-grade families. 9<sup>th</sup>-grade tours will finish on February 11. An evening of Excellence was well attended and received, with 40 staff members presenting.
- Cosa Enrollment: 50 students outside the district were accepted to Alpharetta High School. No additional details have been provided to the counseling department.
- Recycling: We are evaluating the one-year recycling contract and, in parallel, are looking at other waste recycling options beyond WM.
- Capital Enhancements: The final bids for the shade structure have been reviewed, and we expect them to be awarded in April/May. The theater technology enhancements are being shared on campus.
- Culture update: Flag fundraising will go towards a cultural recognition student board.

## <u>Discussion Item: Counseling Presentation (Taylor)</u>

- Counseling is staffing for 6 or 7 counselors but feeling capacity challenges.
- Counseling is asking for a TA to support documentation work, trade talks, GA Technology math, school tours, and general social media.

## Discussion Item: Budget Committee and Outreach and Communications Committee (All)

- Budget Committee: Scheduled meeting for March 3 but may push with the push of the budget timeline
- Community Outreach: The election is being marketed for new candidates for the governance council. There are 2 parent seats and 1 teacher seat. Election will be taking place between April 16<sup>th</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup>.
