

In the Fall, The Southport CoLAB partnered with Sacred Heart University's Isabelle Farrington College of Education & Human Development (FCEHD) to launch Connecticut's first dyslexia graduate certificate program. By participating in research studies with The Peabody College of Education and Human Development at Vanderbilt, the Haskins Lab/Yale University, and the Florida Center for Reading Research on the Developmental English Lexicon Project, The Southport CoLAB continues to bridge research to practice by facilitating the delivery of industry-leading, innovative, research and evidence-based curriculum to students and training to teachers.


