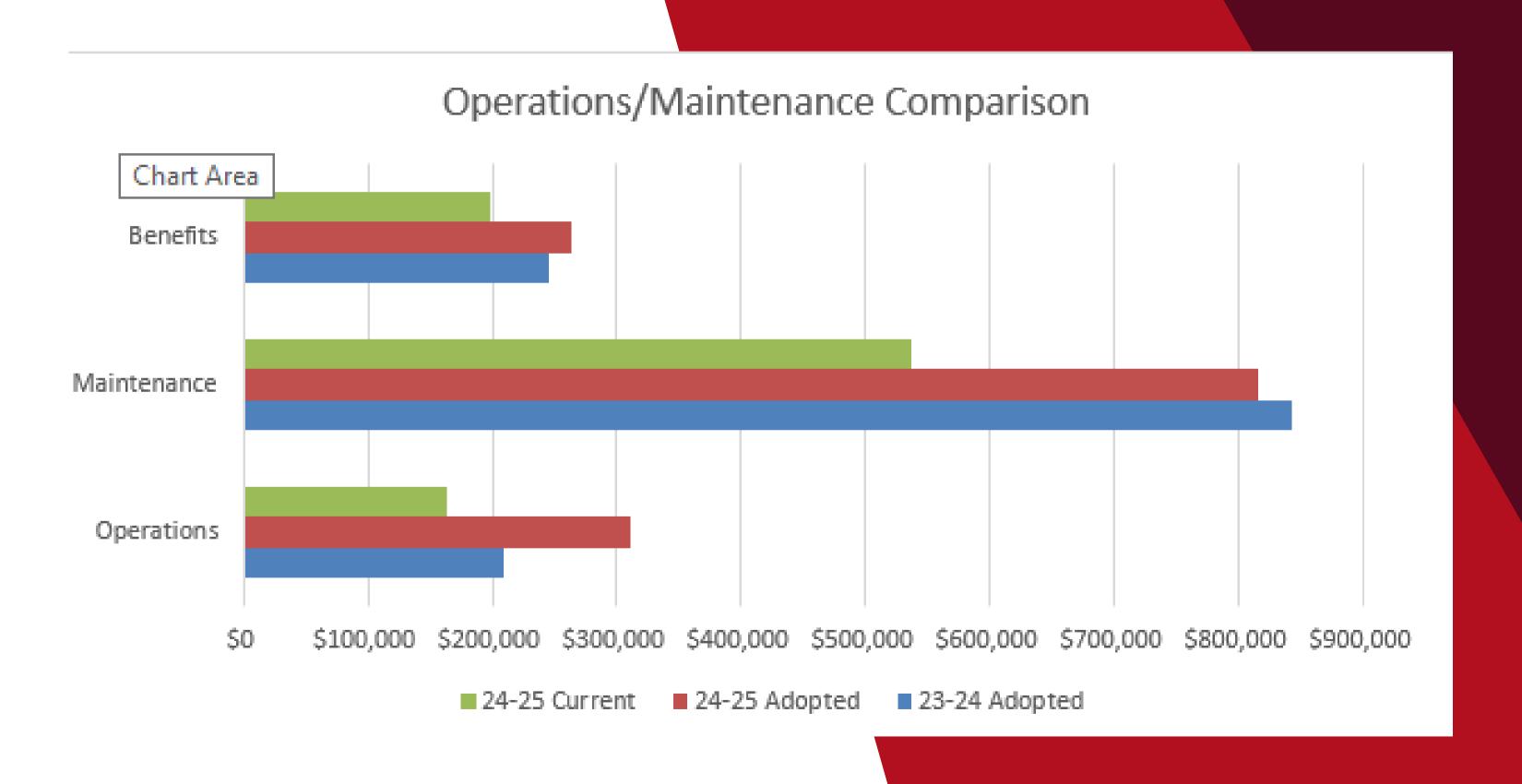

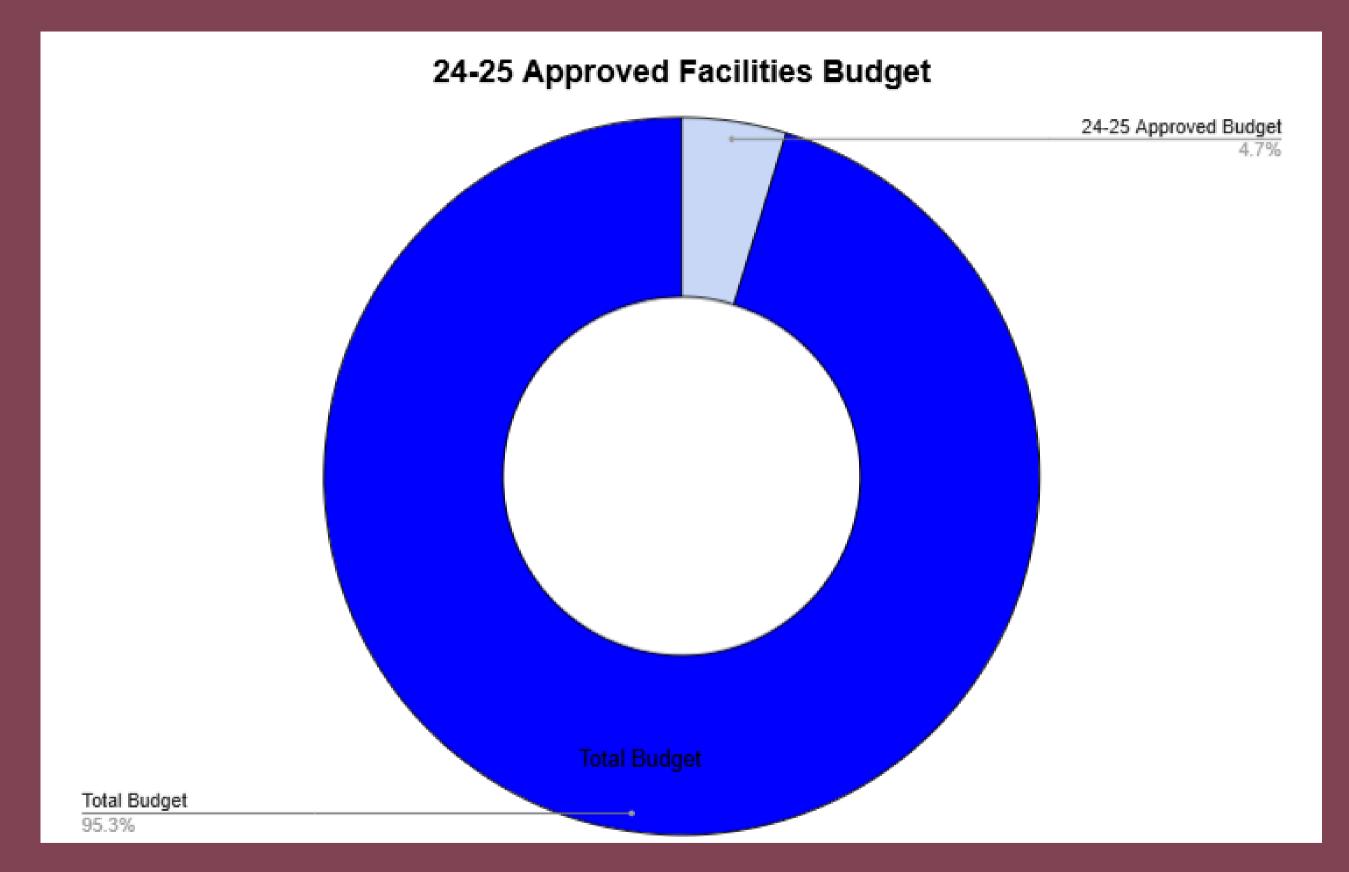

#### Three Types of Aid

#### **BOCES Administrative Aid**

- 1. Reimbursement for base year admin. costs less certain deductions
- 2. 3 options for allocating costs among components
- Min. aid ratio = 36%

#### **BOCES Services Aid**

ACCOUNT OF THE OWNER, AND POST OF

- 1. Reimbursement for base year service costs less certain deductions
- Not all services are eligible for aid
- Approval for aid from SED
- 4. Min. aid ratio = 36%

#### **BOCES Facilities Aid**

- 1. Reimbursement for current year approved facility expenses
- 2. Expenses include construction, purchase or lease
- 3. No min. aid ratio

Aid is paid directly to the BOCES and then distributed to districts in February, June and September

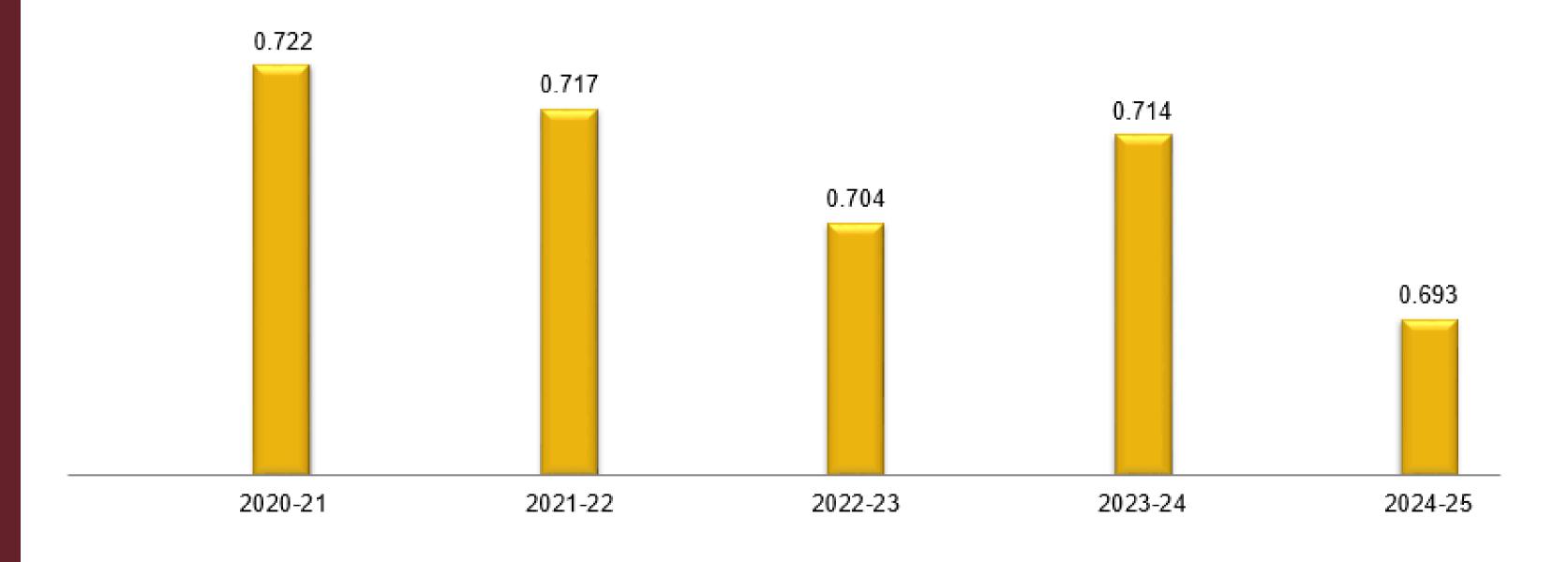

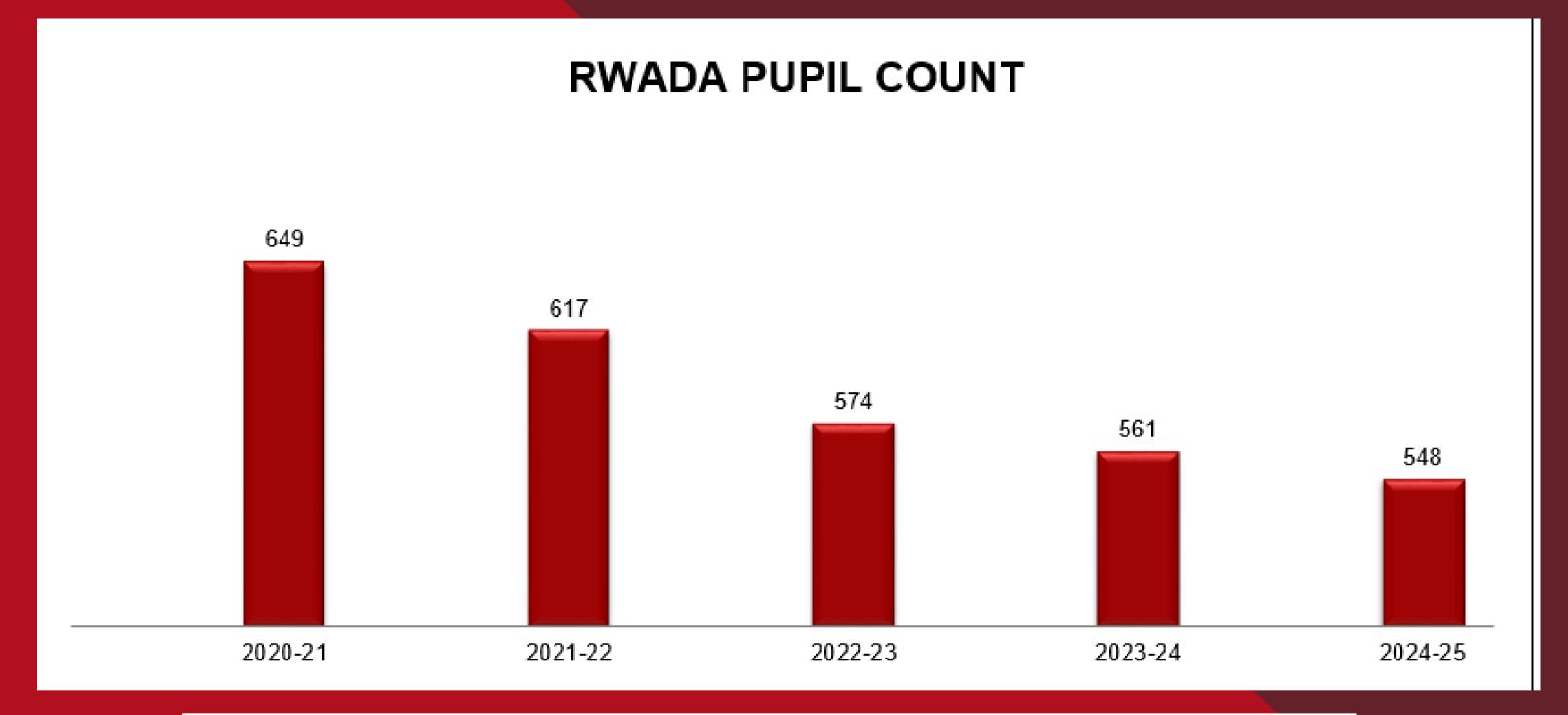

#### ADMIN/SERVICES AID RATIO



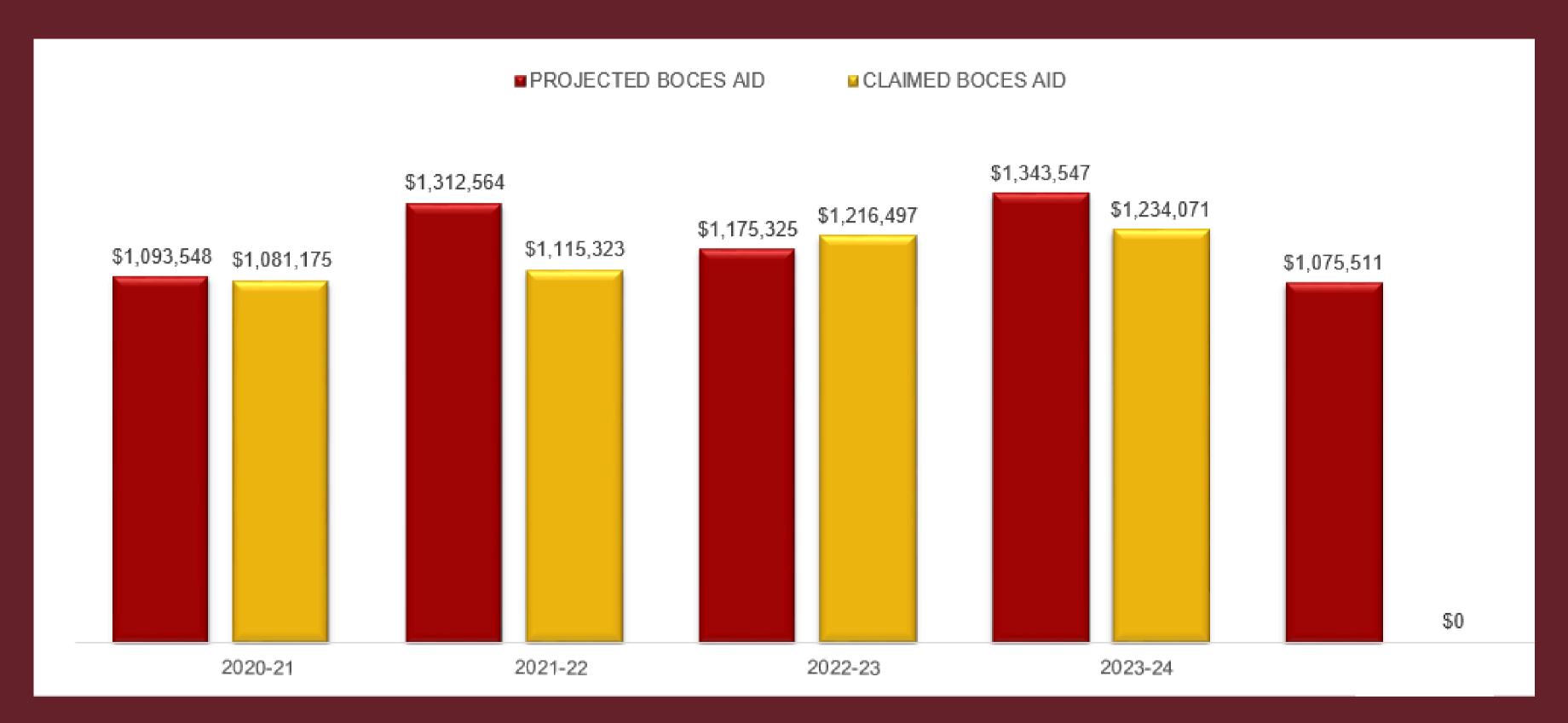
Oriskany Central School District Aid Ratio's
