GPA

$$\text{GPA} = \frac{\text{Total Grade Points}}{\text{Total Credits}}$$

Example Calculation:

- Total Grade Points: 4.0 (A) + 3.0 (B) + 4.5 (A in honors) + 2.0 (C) = 13.5
- Total Credits: 1 + 1 + 1 + 1 = 4
- GPA = $\frac{13.5}{4} = 3.375$

NCVPS

- 2.5 unweighted GPA required
- www.ncvps.org/catalogs/
- Regular, Honors, AP courses
- Only courses that are not offered On-Campus or for Scheduling Conflict
- Applications due by June 6 for Fall courses due before Winter Break for Spring courses

Onslow Virtual School

- Separate school – fully virtual
- Requires an application and approval

Dual Enrollment

- 2.8 unweighted GPA required
- Course offerings depend on Coastal
- Must meet registration requirements
- Preferably seniors

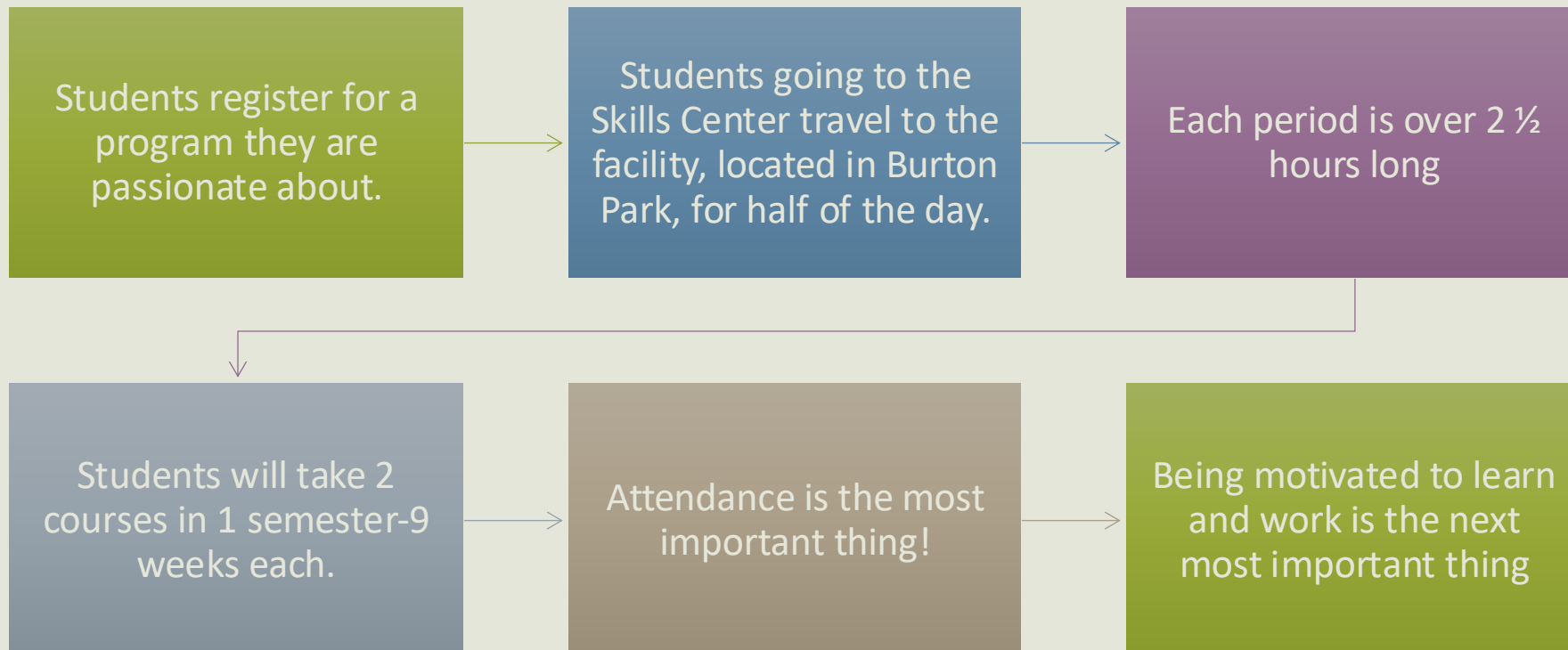
