



















CTE Internship

Internships let you gain hands-on experience in a career field while earning high school credit!


- 12th graders, or 11th graders with a Level II CTE Course




What is Career and College Promise (CCP)?

Dual Enrollment * NC Career and College Promise

The CCP program offers eligible high school juniors and seniors the opportunity to enroll in college courses. This initiative allows students to accelerate the completion of college certificates, diplomas, and associate degrees, supporting their transition to higher education or career pathways. Additionally, CCP can facilitate college transfer opportunities, enabling students to further their academic and professional goals.

CCP Benefits

- Free tuition
- Semester scheduled courses
- C or higher transferable college credit
- Introduction to college setting
- 5.0 scale weighted high school GPA

Requirements to Apply


- High School Senior or Junior
- > Transfer Pathways 2.8 Unweighted GPA
- > Certificate Pathways Principal Recommendation
- · Speak with the CCCC Liaison available at each OCS high school campus
- Complete an application with an unofficial high school transcript attached each semester

10th Grade Opportunity

CCP is open for a select few 10th-grade students who meet additional requirements. These students can meet with their Liaison to discuss the additional steps/testing. If approved, they are only allowed one seated CCP course.



SAT SCHOLARSHIP



All students who meet requirements are guaranteed the scholarship

- 1) Have a cumulative high school GPA of 3.5 on a weighted scale at the end of the 1st semester of the senior year
- 2) Earn a composite score of 1100 or higher on the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) in reading and math only OR a combined score of 23 on the ACT
- 3) Complete required English, math, science, social studies, and foreign language courses required for the NC Academic Scholars Endorsement
- 4) Perform 75 hours of community service for a \$750 scholarship and 100 hours of community service for \$1,500 scholarship. (must be approved by the Executive Director)

Morehead-Cain Scholarship (UNC-Chapel Hill)

- First merit scholarship program in the U.S.
- Full four-year scholarship covering tuition, room, board, books, and laptop
- Four summer enrichment programs
- Nomination required from eligible schools by October
- Key criteria: Leadership, character, scholarship, and physical vigor
- Deadline typically in October for nominated students

The John M. Belk Scholarship (Davidson College)

- Full tuition, fees, room and board at Davidson College
- Annual stipend for books and special learning experiences
- Two special study stipends for summer experiences
- Nomination required by school counselor/head by December
- Focus on intellectual curiosity, leadership, and service
- Approximately 8 scholars selected annually

NC State Park Scholarships

- Four-year scholarship covering full cost of attendance
- Leadership and enrichment opportunities
- Learning Labs and unique developmental experiences
- School nomination or self-nomination by October
- Four pillars: Scholarship, leadership, service, character
- Approximately 40 scholarships awarded annually

Levine Scholars Program (UNC Charlotte)

- Full tuition, room, board, and fees for four years
- Grant funding for service projects and civic engagement
- Four summer experiences including study abroad
- Direct application available through Common App
- Emphasis on commitment to community service
- Application deadline typically in October

Robertson Scholars Leadership Program (Duke/UNC)

- Unique dual-university experience between Duke and UNC
- Full tuition, room and board, and additional funding
- Three funded summer experiences
- Direct application through Robertson portal

- Application deadline typically in November

Compelling essays and recommendations



Application Timeline Overview

- August: Begin application process
- September: Gather recommendations
- October: Most early deadlines (Morehead-Cain, Park, Levine)
- November: Robertson deadline
- December: Belk Scholarship deadline
- January-March: Finalist interviews
- April: Final decisions announced

Consider applying to multiple programs








