



 Score proficient or above on ELA10 and Algebra I MCAP Assessments by the end of grade 10



Early College (EC) Program



Who can apply for the Early College Program?

Students entering 11th grade in the 2025-2026 school year who meet College and Career Readiness (CCR) standards and are eligible for Dual Enrollment by the end of 10th grade may participate in the Early College (EC) Program.

Acceptance into the Early College Program

Students entering 11th grade in the 2025-2026 school year who meet College and Career Readiness (CCR) standards and are eligible for Dual Enrollment by the end of 10th grade may participate in the Early College (EC) Program.

Admission requirements:

- Students will complete an Early College application.
- Students have completed all 9th and 10th grade requirements, including any statewide testing (specifically, two credits each of high school English, math, science, and social studies, including English 10, Algebra 1, Geometry, Biology, and Government).
- Students have been deemed College and Career Ready as defined by MSDE, Blueprint, and CCPS.
- Have a 3.0 cumulative GPA (through 10th grade) and submit their high school transcript.
- Be eligible for ENGL-101 and college-level mathematics.
- Recommendation letter from CCPS School Counselor.
- Must have their own transportation to Carroll Community College.

Once Admitted: Early College Program

- Students will meet with a CCC Academic Advisor and attend a group advising session to complete registration.
- Early College students will have priority registration, one week prior to new student registration.
- Early College students will be required to attend an Early College New Student Orientation program.
- Early College Students will be required to sign a FERPA release form.

Students will enter the Early College program in a hybrid-cohort format - meaning that students within the degree program will take the same courses each semester but will not necessarily be enrolled in the same section.

For instance, all students in the Early College program but will take SOC-101 in their first semester but may be in any section of that course (including online sections, if desired).



ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

according to the student's grade to access selected courses that CCPS will cover the cost of tuition, materials, and fees for students in the program.

GROUP 1

JUNIORS AND SENIORS, TAKING CLASSES AT CCPS (CCR OR NOT CCR):

Has an overall, unweighted GPA of 2.5 to qualify for the classes other than math, and a 2.6 for most math credit math classes. To qualify for certain higher level math courses, may need a B or higher in Algebra II.

GROUP 2

JUNIORS AND SENIORS, TAKING CLASSES AT CCC, OR ONLINE (CCR OR NOT CCR)

Has an overall, unweighted GPA of at least 2.6.

GROUP 3

FRESHMEN AND SOPHOMORES, TAKING CLASSES AT CCC OR ONLINE:

- Has attained CCR status
- May only take classes outside of school hours or in the summer
- CCPS provides a recommendation letter



Tuition, Fees, & Materials

CCPS students may take additional courses, courses not on the list, and/or in the winter or summer semesters, if they choose to pay out-of-pocket.
