

We are excited to begin piloting a new English Language Arts unit called *Voices in America*! This unit will introduce students to inspiring individuals throughout history who stood up for what they believed in. Through engaging stories and discussions, we will explore important topics such as women's suffrage and the civil rights movement.

Students will read about brave people who used their voices to create change, helping them understand the power of speaking up for what they believe is right. As we explore these historical moments, we encourage thoughtful conversations at home about standing up for what is right and making a difference in our communities. We look forward to an exciting journey of learning and

discovery with our third graders!





Students are successfully swimming through the year!

In ELA we are wrapping up our second ELA unit, *The Lighting Thief.* We will begin our third unit, *The American Revolution* in which students will learn about the Patriots and the Loyalists. By the end of the unit, they will choose a side to defend in the war. In social studies, we are studying Early Civilizations in North America. We will learn about Louisiana's first peoples.





The school year is swimming by at full speed, and we're in crunch time! It's more important than ever for students to buckle down and stay focused. In Math, students have been diving deep into geometry with Module 5, where they've been constructing, analyzing, and classifying shapes like trapezoids, kites, parallelograms, rectangles, rhombuses, and squares. They've explored these shapes like navigating through an underwater coral reef, uncovering all their unique properties. In Science, students have been exploring the phenomenon question: What separates Earth from outer space? They examined the boundary between Earth's atmosphere and outer space, coming up with analogies to better understand it. They discovered that Earth's atmosphere is like a glowing ocean of gas particles that scatter sunlight, giving it a bright blue appearance, while outer space is a vast, empty abyss, black as the deep sea. In ELA, students will soon wrap up Unit 3 by composing an essay, deciding if coming to America was worth the journey, similar to embarking on an underwater exploration to discover new worlds. Afterward, they will dive into the Application Unit, focusing on writing, poetry, and vocabulary—ready to explore new depths of creativity. In Social Studies, students have completed all the standards for 5th grade, and now they are reviewing everything like deep-sea explorers preparing for the big LEAP dive. They'll revisit all the units to help them prepare for the upcoming assessments. With the finish line in sight, it's time to dive in headfirst and make the most of every moment!







The Jaguar Choir did a marvelous job representing R.J. Vial at Young Artists Live @ Lafon (YALL) Fest. Our next step is to take all of our hard work and learning experiences and bring them to the Louisiana Music Educators Association (LMEA) District VII Large Ensemble Assessment on March 21. These Singing Jaguars are really working so hard and are shining everywhere they go.

The Jaguar Choir will also perform at ArtsFest on Saturday, March 16. Be on the lookout for specific information and performance time from Mrs. Moore. If you have never been to ArtsFest, it is a wonderful day of artistic activities, performances, and exploration. The event takes place at the Dr. Rodney R. Lafon Performing Arts Center, and runs from 10 AM - 3 PM. We hope to see you there.


