### Reading with Your Child...

- As your child reads, talk with him about what is happening in the story. Use words like first, next, then, and last.
- Discuss characters' feelings. How is the (character's name) feeling? What makes him/her feel (sad, happy, excited, nervous, frustrated, angry, upset, proud)? How can you tell (character's name) is feeling (happy/sad/angry/etc.)?
- Discuss characters' actions. What was (character's name) doing in the story?
- Make predictions. What do you think might happen next? Why?
- What was your favorite part in the story? Why?
- What does this story make you think of? What does it remind you of?

# Reading with Your Child (cont'd)...

As students are reading it is important that they are **making connections** to the experiences they have had or other books they have read. The strategy of making connections is important to build their comprehension. When your child is finished reading their book, ask them:

- What does this book/story make you think of?
- Does this remind you of another book you have read?
- Does this remind you of anything that has happened in your life?


Brainpop Jr. Movie of the Week Grade range: K to 4.




#### <u>In Like a Lion,</u> Out Like a Lamb

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
