Information about ACT and SAT

Information about the ACT is available at www.act.org.

Juniors will be taking the School Day ACT on Tuesday, April 8th. The test will be paper and pencil. Because it is a School Day ACT, students do not register beforehand – we will visit Theology classes to assist them in registering. The fee for the ACT (\$50.50) will be added on the student's FACTS account.

If a junior decides to retake the ACT on a later date (see dates below), they will register at MyACT.org.

Students will have the option to choose whether they want to take an online ACT or paper and pencil ACT.

Sending Test Scores to a college

If a college or university requires a test score, a student may choose to submit a test score from either the ACT or SAT. This is the case for ALL colleges / universities that require a student to submit a test score. Counselors will explain this process when students return to school in August.

While a decision to return to requiring test scores for admission should have already been made, there is the possibility that a college or university may yet announce in the next month that they will return to requiring a test score for the Class of 2026. We would advise that you check with any college or university that your junior is considering applying to just in case.

ACT / SAT Test Prep Opportunities
