Testing ROV Vehicles in Aerospace

On Tuesday, senior's in Ms. Thompson's
Aerospace Engineering class visited the
YMCA to test out their remotely
operated vehicle (ROV) designs in the
pool. These ROV's aim to simulate what
it would be like to navigate outer space
surfaces, like Mars, using a rover.
Students put their designs in the water,
tested the buoyancy, and maneuvered
the device using a camera, showing
what it would be like to control a vehicle
without physically being there.



Health Science and AFC Make and Deliver Valentine Cards



In the spring of 1995, Nate Cartwright has lost everything: his parents are dead, his only brother wants nothing to do with him, and he's been fired from his job as a journalist in Washington, DC.
