







AP Psychology Sensation Fair

Ms. Weaver's AP Psychology class participated in the Sensation Fair this week. Their current unit is focused on the theories of sensation and perception and how each of our seven senses works. The Sensation Fair has different stations to test six of those senses. A few examples include:

- To demonstrate kinesthetic sense, students tested how well they could accurately touch the tip of their nose with their finger while their eyes were closed.
- The vestibular sense focuses on balance, so students spun around baseball bats several times and tried to balance on one foot.
- For touch, students had Q-tips and toothpicks pressed along their arms to see if they could accurately tell the difference between the sharp and soft stimuli.

This continued into a second round, where students tested their taste, smell, and vision. Overall, it was a great time with many laughs as students got into hilarious situations when their senses failed.
