CURRENT PROJECT UPDATES

CAPITAL OUTLAY PROJECT SPRING 2025

Work on the high school stage floor is scheduled to begin at the end of March. Contractors will be removing all of the cracked and deteriorated tiles that will be replaced with a stage appropriate wood floor. This project should be completed by the beginning of May and will be showcased at our Spring music concerts and awards ceremonies.

Capital Improvement Project

The Capital Improvement Project was approved by the New York State Education Department last week. This project will be sent out to bid very soon with work anticipated to start this spring. As a reminder, this project includes new elementary windows and lintels, new elementary classroom floors, a new elementary stage curtain, new elementary gym wall pads, plumbing work, necessary hvac and digital controls work, a new bus lift, fire alarm system updates at the bus garage, varsity soccer field drainage improvements, high school gym floor restoration and painting, new gym/stage lights and sound systems and controls, new interior stairway treads and landings throughout the high school, kitchen plumbing work, replacement of various doors at both buildings, masonry work on both buildings, high school chimney reconstruction, and parking lot and drive lanes reconstruction and paving throughout the campus.

BRICK BY BRICK

LEGO CLUB



Our Elementary LEGO clubs, called Brick by Brick, have begun.

Currently we have about 45 students in grades 3-6 participating in the after school clubs. Students have been divided into two groups with one group being made up of students in grades 3 and 4 and one group made up of students in grades 4-6.

Once a month, each group meets to work on a LEGO build or challenge. Each build requires students to follow steps to build the project and then gives students the opportunity to modify and create in order to

improve their build or to solve a problem. We are working with the LEGO Spike sets which require students to program LEGO hub units to power motors, LED lights, or light sensors. Students use Scratch and/or Python coding to program the hubs to add motion, lights, sounds, and more to their projects.

We have only had a few meetings but already we're learning a lot and having a great time!
