New York Yankees - A Team Preview

Pitching: The Strength of the Team?

If Aroldis Chapman can regain his elite velocity and form, he could be a powerful weapon in the late innings. This bullpen has the potential to dominate, and with a rotation that can go deep into games, the Yankees should be in a strong position to finish out close contests.

Offense: A New-Look Lineup

Offensively, the Yankees' 2025 lineup is stacked, but a few key changes will define the season. Aaron Judge, coming off his historic 2023 MVP season, remains the heart of this offense. Defense: A Much-Improved Unit

Defensively, the Yankees could have one of their strongest teams in years. With Bellinger joining Aaron Judge in the outfield, the team will boast one of the best defensive outfields in the game. Bellinger's ability to cover ground and make highlight-reel plays will be a huge asset, especially alongside Judge's range and arm strength. Infield defense is also a major strength with Peraza at short and Anthony Volpe possibly getting time at second base. Peraza's defensive chops have impressed since his call-up, and with him holding down shortstop, the Yankees will have a formidable infield. The Yankees' defense will be critical to support their pitchers and limit scoring opportunities for opponents.
