<b>Language Arts</b>	<p><b>Letters: Jj, Qu, Yy, Zz, and short vowel sounds of /a/, /e/, /i/, /o/, /u/</b></p> <p>Review reading and writing simple words with short vowel sounds like jet, yam, zit gum, and rot. Review reading and writing beginning sounds, middle sounds, and ending sounds of words. Also keep <b>writing sentences</b> at home-beginning each sentence with a capital letter, leaving space between words, writing words using alphabet letter sounds, and ending it with a punctuation mark.</p> <p><b>Fry words for this month include: said, that, who, from, there, out, now, words, all, each, could, for, find, first, its, was, too, would, their</b></p> <p><b>The goal is being able to read 100+ words at the end of the year! See the back of this newsletter for the entire list of Fry words.</b></p>
<b>Math</b>	<p><b>Adding and Subtracting within 10.</b></p> <p><b>Composing and decomposing teen numbers.</b></p> <p><b>Building with Shapes.</b></p> <p>Review counting, reading, and writing numbers 0-20</p> <p>Review 2-d shapes-circle, triangle, square, rectangle, and hexagon.</p> <p>Review 3-d shapes-sphere, cone, cylinder, and cube.</p> <p>Review counting to 100 by 1's and 10's.</p>
<b>Science/Social Studies</b>	<p>Discussing Earth materials like rocks, soil, and water.</p> <p>Begin discussing spring time, its weather, planting seeds and how they grow, and animals/offspring.</p>

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
