# **Application Materials**

- Academic Profile/Rigor of High School Transcript
  - Academic performance Did you <u>successfully</u> challenge yourself?
  - Senior year is important. Mid-Year reports are sent
  - Grades/GPA from 9<sup>th</sup> grade-present
- Standardized Testing SATs & ACTs
  - o To test or not to test?
  - Test optional and test-blind policies (<u>fairtest.orq</u>)
  - Some universities going back to requiring test scores Dartmouth, Yale, UT Austin...must check websites to confirm
- **Recommendations** (2 from teachers, 1 from your school counselor)
- Application and Essay

The Authentic "YOU" Your voice needs to be heard!

- Extracurricular Activities In-or-out of school/Community service/Jobs
- Interview (if offered)
- Common Data Set Google Common Data Set and "school name" to obtain information about what schools consider in application process

   Harvard, Brown, Yale, UT Austin, UPenn, Cornell, Ohio State


## Other SCOIR Tools

- . Junior and Parent Surveys (Brag Sheets)





# Structuring Your List



#### REACH SCHOOLS

Student profile is below the typical admitted student

Highly selective schools are reaches for EVERYONE!!!

3-4 Reach Schools

#### TARGET SCHOOLS

Student profile matches the stated profile of average admitted student

4-5 Target Schools

#### Scoir

can help you identify your profile and school profiles!

#### Likely Admit Schools

Student profile exceeds the stated profile of average admitted student

4-5 Likely Admit Schools

DO NOT APPLY TO SCHOOLS YOU DO NOT WANT TO ATTEND



### Create a Balanced List

- Find out if the school is a good fit for you
- Create a balanced and realistic list of schools
  - 2-3 reach schools
  - 4-5 target schools
  - 2-3 likely-admit schools
- Don't apply to schools where you have no intention of attending
- Spend time on the application. The quality of the essays and supplementals matter! Make sure you give yourself adequate time for the potential supplemental questions

# Types of Admission

Early Decision/ Single Choice Early Action

#### **Early Decision:**

- -Student can only apply to 1 school
- -If accepted, must withdraw applications to other schools -Binding agreement

#### SCEA:

- -Non binding agreement
- -Many schools you cannot apply to other private colleges during early rounds

Early Action

Schools set a specific deadline (usually in Nov/Dec)

Students who apply by this earlier date will be notified earlier - usually by February 1

Student does not have to attend the school if accepted.

Regular Decision

Schools set a specific deadline for all of the applications

Review all applications after this submission date

Rolling Admission

Applications are accepted during a set timeframe but are reviewed as they are received.

Acceptance letters are sent when decisions are made

ex. Penn State, Pittsburgh, Michigan State, Montclair State

### Student Driven Process

The student should be leading this process from start to finish including:

- Completing Common App, Personal statement, and all supplemental essays
- Checking in and updating school counselor on their progress
- Communication with individual colleges if issues occur with documents
- Researching schools and checking on ALL requirements
