

# **High School Arts & Activities - Fall Recap**



# **Raytown High School**

- RHS choir programs had seven students audition, and be selected for KC Metro All-District Choirs.
- The Girls Tennis program completed their fourth full year and finished with their most wins of any season to date.
- The Boys Swimming team placed 20th at the Missouri State Championship in October. They were undefeated this year in dual meets with a record of 15 and 0, and won the Conference Championship.
- Larry Porter and Cyiree Arty were both selected to All-State Football.
- The Girls Swim program (RHS & RSHS) has over 50 girls. This is the largest participation in years.
- Six students attended an art competition at RayPec HS for the first time. It had a student art show and live art competition events. Three students took home awards at the show.
- Theatre put on a successful fall musical, Little Shop of Horrors, and is preparing for the winter play, Clue, which performs Feb 20-22 at 7:00pm.
- FCCLA (Family, Career and Community Leaders of America) had four students attend the student-led Missouri FCCLA Fall Leadership Conference.
- Girls golf had 18 students on the team this year including 12 new golfers - the largest group in decades. They had a successful season including JV placing 2nd overall team score at Conference.
- The Jaywalkers are working hard inside the building and out in the community. In addition to practices and competitions they also volunteered at KC Pet Project this Fall.

# **Raytown South High School**

- Cardettes received 2nd in Pom and 1st in Hip Hop at the NDA Blue Springs Regional Competition in January 2025. As of publication the team is Regional Champions for Intermediate Hip Hop. The team leaves for Nationals in Florida in February 2025.
- Girls Basketball earned a win over William Chrisman 51-30.
- The Scholar Bowl team has jumped out to a great start, placing in the top three at each of their first three competitions.
- Raytown South hosted a 50th year reunion of the 1974 football team. The 1974 Cardinals were ranked #1 in the state of Missouri in Class 4A - the largest class in the state at the time. The team went undefeated in the regular season with a record of 10-0, won the BIG 6 Suburban Conference Title, and qualified for MSHSAA 4A Semifinals.
- The 2024 Football team ended the season 4-6.
- Girls wrestling medaled in their conference tournament the first time in school history to have a team from South High place.
- Raytown South's first ever Mock Trial team competed in its first competition and nearly defeated a state-ranked program.
- Fine Arts: The programs in the Fine Arts Department (Theater, Band, Choir) patiently awaited the opening of the new Performing Arts Center in Jan. 2025 and will now perform in the new space for all spring performances.




# 2023 Bond Update: 'Our Children, Our Investment'
