This fair is organized by our school counseling department and the goal is to help 9th grade students learn about different career options as they prepare to transition to EBHS next year. Students are called down to the fair by their school counselor group during the school day. We appreciate the professionals who are taking time out of their day to meet with our 9th graders and provide them with helpful career information and experience.

 - Two 9th grade students are organizing a 5K Walk on Sunday, March 16 at the EBHS Track as part of their Butterfly Effect Club project. Proceeds from the walk will benefit the K.  - A group of 9th grade students will be selling cookies as part of their Butterfly Effect Club project at the evening performances of *13 Jr.* on March 26-28 and proceeds from the cookie sales will be donated to Churchill Drama Club to help support future productions and events.
 - Our Student Council led a very successful food drive for all homerooms in the school that concluded today. Food and supplies will be donated to Replenish, the Middlesex County Emergency Food Distribution Network to help resupply food pantries and soup kitchens around the county.
 - Students in Sources of Strength recently visited Warnsdorfer Elementary School to read to elementary students for Read Across America. The event was very well received by the elementary students, and we appreciate the leadership and initiative that our students showed in modeling the importance of learning how to read.
 - Our Positive Behavior Supports in Schools initiative is leading a Penny Wars competition across the classes, and they are collecting coins to donate to charity. The class with the most coins will choose a charity to donate the money. Collection jars are located in all the offices in the building. Each penny collected counts as a positive point and each silver coin (nickel, dime, or quarter) counts as negative points. The grade level with the most points will get to "pie" a teacher in the face with a whipped cream pie for their efforts. The teachers who have volunteered to be "pied" are: for 9th grade, Ms. Fordham and Mr. Russo; for 8th grade, Ms. Ciotola and Mr. Talbot; and for 7th grade, Mr. Ruszala and Mr. Baron.
