
# Issaquah School District














## Contacts

## 2025-26 Incoming Kindergarten Registration

It is an exciting time of year as the Issaquah School District begins to reach out to our community in preparation of welcoming the incoming Kindergarten at their neighborhood school. The Issaquah School District offers full day Kindergarten at no cost to all students. If you have a child who will be a kindergartener for the 2025-2026, **please visit the ISD New Student Enrollment website**. Students who are turning 5 years old by August 31, 2025, are eligible for enrollment for the 2025-2026 school year.

Schools plan to meet with incoming Kindergarten families in February and March 2025. Schools will share this information in their electronic bulletins and on their website. Connect with your neighborhood school for more details about that meeting. This meeting will prepare families to complete the online registration. Registration begins March 12, 2025. Please visit the **ISD New Student Enrollment website** to begin your incoming kindergartner's registration. Once the online portion is complete, you will work with your neighborhood school to complete the enrollment process. *If you cannot access the online application, please call or visit your neighborhood school for assistance.* 

 Please Note: Students in the Early Childhood Education (ECE) Program, SLP Program, Early Childhood Education & Assistance Program (ECEAP), Transition to Kindergarten (TK) and those previously evaluated by Special Services (ex. Childfind) must still complete the online kindergarten enrollment process to register for kindergarten. Please start the process as though you are a new student to the Issaguah School District.

School offices are open from 8:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. to assist you. Please note for your convenience, arrival and dismissal times are very high traffic times for the school office. Picking up or submitting required documents at this time may result in longer wait times.

All incoming kindergartners are registering at their neighborhood school. The Issaquah School District doesn't allow for families to choose the school their students attend. Your neighborhood school is determined by your home address.

## • Ongoing registration for Kindergarten

- K enrollment is now open for the next school year (2025-2026).
- Students are guaranteed enrollment at their neighborhood school and can simply enroll by starting the online enrollment process on our <u>New Student</u> <u>Enrollment webpage</u>.
- If you school attendance boundary changes, students will be asked to move to their new neighborhood school (all paperwork will transfers within ISD schools) contact the registrar at your student's school with an updated <u>Change</u> <u>of Address Form</u>.


#### New Student Enrollment is now open for the 2024-2025 School Year only. Enrollment for the 2025-2026 School Year will begin on March 12, 2025.

The Issaquah School District utilizes an online application process to enroll new students. This process is for students not currently enrolled in an ISD school; students in grades K-12 transferring between schools within the district do not need to complete an enrollment application. Prior to using the online application process, families are advised to have the required documents available to upload into the application. You may save as you go and do not have to complete it all in one sitting. The completed application, once submitted online, will be available to the school for approval. Submitted applications will not be approved until all required documents are received by the school.

# Information about Registration

- **Most** of the registration is online.
- Once the application has been approved, you will receive an automated email from the district with confirmation.
- The school registrar will email you with more information.
- Email or call school registrars with any questions or if you don't hear back from a school registrar.
- Check your junk mail/spam folder common problem.
- Residence verification is required as part of the enrollment process:
  - Documents needed include:
    - Purchase Papers for home OR Property Tax Statement OR Lease Agreement—original copy.
       If you are renting/leasing your residence in which all utilities are included in rent, you can provide the rental agreement on PROPERTY MANAGEMENT LETTERHEAD ONLY.
    - PSE bill at that residence
      - Bill must include the parent/guardian's name and address and be within 30 days.



## **OPEN ENROLLMENT at ISD ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS**

Families can complete Open Enrollment applications for the following:

- •Students within the district seeking to transfer to another school within the district.
- •Students within the district interested in attending a school in a different district.
- •Students from another district wishing to transfer to a school in the Issaquah School District.

•Beginning March 12 and ending April 30, ISD will be accepting Open Enrollment applications from families who wish to transfer schools at the beginning of the 2025-2026 school year.

•4 Elementary Schools are at capacity and are "closed" to students who do not already live within their boundary area.

•Families can complete Open Enrollment applications beginning March 12 and ending April 30 for students within the district seeking to transfer to another school within the district.

•Students residing in school districts outside the Issaquah School District and want to attend a school within the Issaquah School District may apply for an inter-district transfer. These transfers are approved on a space-available basis after transfers within the district have been accommodated.





Example: Cedar Trails attendance Map






# Students follow their feeder pattern school

- Feeder pattern system elementary schools students attend specific middle schools and then high schools.
- Some elementary school boundaries split students to two different middle schools
- If your family moves out of the school boundary area during the year, your child will have to change schools.
- Students are guaranteed enrollment at their neighborhood school and can simply enroll by starting the online enrollment process on our <u>New Student Enrollment</u> <u>webpage</u>.
- Reminder –ISD is Public Schools so ALL students who live within the ISD school boundaries are eligible to enroll at an ISD school if they turn 5 by August 31, 2025.

# **Family Connections Meeting** for K families only

- 1:1 meeting with teacher Required, student and parent will attend (no other families/parents)
- August 28, 29 and Sept 2 one of these 3 days for about 20-30 mins (before K starts but students in grades 1-5 has begun).
- School staff will contact you regarding your appointment day and time sometime in August. (Mark your calendar)
- Meeting with each family separately, child and teacher can also connect.
- Time for student to see the classroom calm any anxiety or questions
- <u>Resource for parents</u> The Kindergarten teacher may ask questions from this document.





# Meet the Teacher – August 27

## **Event for all students K-5 at all Elementary Schools**

- Check School Bulletin in late August for more information.
- All K-5 students have an opportunity to visit the school and teacher the day before school starts for students in Grades 1-5
- Casual/informal visit to the classroom (Time may be based on grade level or last name - 2 time slots so classroom and the school is not as crowded)
- Opportunity to drop school supplies at child's desk
- Opportunity to see other students in the class before school begins
- Opportunity for parents to meet other parents in the class and at school.
- PTSA often has popsicles or kids play on the playground with parent supervision.





# Kindergarten - Full Day at all schools

- The Issaquah School District offers Full Day Kindergarten at no cost to all students.
- Students in K follow the same bell times as the rest of the students at school.
- Most schools begins at 9:15 and ends at 3:40 (Check your child's school's bell schedule)
- Students will ride the bus with others grades 1-5 (unless walking distance) to and from school. (K students ride in the front of the bus.)
- Same teacher and classroom all day except for Specialist classes (PE, Music and Library)
- Students with MLL services and Special education services integrated in class (additional teacher in class or students work outside the classroom in small groups).





# Option – Half-day Kindergarten (offered at all elementary schools)

- Students attend three hours in the morning. (No PM option)
- Students start at same time and parent pick-up at school at end of the three-hour day session.
- Morning transportation by bus only (unless lives in walking distance) with the regular bus pick-up schedule for the neighborhood.
- Check with teacher regarding what school and learning activities occur in the afternoon for that classroom.



# Early Entrance

- Early Entrance Assessment performed by professional and submitted by July 15, 2025 (District forms and handwritten signature required)
- 30-day trial period in kindergarten reviewed by principal and teacher for permanent placement
- Parents may choose to delay having their child start Kindergarten (late spring or summer birthdays till following year depending on readiness of child).

## **Early Entrance**

## Early-Entrance for ISD Kindergarten and First Grade

Applications are available through the Elementary Education Department / Maya Greene - (425-837-7025). Applications are due July 15, 2025.

The Issaquah School District is willing to work with families if they believe their child is ready for school early. To be considered for early entrance into kindergarten, a child must be five (5) years of age on or before November 30 of the year of entry. In addition, an assessment report indicating the child has met all the requirements stated below must be received by the District office no later than July 15, 2025:

- 1. Mental ability
- 2. Gross motor skills
- 3. Fine motor skills
- 4. Visual discrimination
- 5. Auditory discrimination
- 6. Emotional/social development
- 7. Language development

A student must score at or above the 90th percentile in all seven categories above as outlined in the Early Entrance Assessment Results form before they can be invited to participate in kindergarten on a probationary basis. For more information, refer to the following:

# Dual Language Program

- Spanish/English Dual Language Program
- At Issaquah Valley Elementary
- Process for registration



- New students to IVE will be asked if they are interested in the program during the registration process. An application must be completed to be considered for the program.
- If your child is a native Spanish speaker, we encourage you to apply.

- Applications received after the lottery deadline of March 28, 2025 at 4:30 pm will be dated in the order received. Students will be placed on the corresponding waiting list in sequential order following the lottery.
- Program lottery will take place on April 21st (10:00-10:30 am) at the ISD Administration Building.



# **Highly Capable Program**

- ALL ISD Kindergarten and 2nd grade students are screened/tested to determine if they are eligible for the highly capable test.
- 2025-2026 Kindergarten students will all take a placement test next year – usually in winter to determine eligibility.
- Specific testing dates will be shared by the school next fall.
- Check website for more details.
- **PRIMARY ENRICHMENT PROGRAM (PEP) |K-2** The Primary Enrichment Program (PEP) is offered at each elementary school. PEP services may include, pull-out or push in model, and/or differentiated instruction within the classroom. SAGE/PEP teachers provide support for these services. Students work on special enrichment projects that incorporate a high level of cognitive demand. One time a week for 30 minutes in Kindergarten. One hour a week in 1st and 2nd grade.





## **MLL/ELL Program**

- More than 1,400 students receive MLL/ELL services K-12 in the ISD.
- Multilingual/English Language Learners certificated teacher support for students.
- Student support in their regular classroom or pulled out for a short time to work in small groups with ELL teacher.
- Eligibility based on an English Language proficiency assessment (WIDA screener) that students take in reading, writing, speaking and listening.
- Students are "exited" from the program when they meet requirements
- Program designed to support students develop English Academic Language proficiency to be successful in learning and engaging in school content.





# **Kindergarten Preparedness**

- Children progress at different paces. Contact school principal, child's pediatrician or Preschool if you have any questions.
- Independence vs. Interdependence
  - Make sure your child can go to the bathroom by themselves (washes hands)
  - Packs backpack and puts on coat and shoes independently.
  - Eats independently open jars/lunch containers, stay focused on eating
  - Clearing workspace and putting things back (follows directions with multi steps)
  - Teach your child their full name and practice writing their first name.
  - Use everyday situations to practice taking turns, sharing, and following routines.

## Kindergarten Readiness

#### Independence and Health Skills to Develop Before Starting School

- $\checkmark$  Uses the toilet, washes hands, and blows nose independently
- ✓ Packs backpack and puts on coat and shoes independently
- ✓ Opens snack and food containers and eats independently
- ✓ Start a consistent bedtime and morning routine before school starts

All children grow at their own pace. They all have unique strengths and skills to work onl Use this as a guide to identify opportunities to learn and grow. Students will continue to work on these skills in kindergartent

## Social and Emotional Development

- Shares ideas and takes turns
- Names or identifies feelings
- C Keeps trying when things feel hard
- and asks for help, if needed
- Suggests solutions to problems

### Language and Communication

- Uses words to express wants, needs, thoughts, and feelings
- Remembers and retells an experience
- Takes turns in conversations
- Follows one and two-step directions

## Early Literacy

- Enjoys stories and knows how to turn pages in a book
- C Knows some letters and letter sounds
- UWrites the letters in their first name

  - in rhyming activities
- Holds a pencil with 3-point finger grip

## Mathematical Thinking

- Counts 10 items accurately
- C Knows basic colors and shapes
- Sorts objects in different ways
- Compares quantities and uses words such as "more" and "less"

## How can I help my child prepare for kindergarten?

#### Get to Know Your School

- Check your school website and sign up for enews! Take your child to welcome events or to play on the playground.
- Walk to the bus stop before the first day so your child gets familiar with the routine. Attend the Bus Ride-along event in August!
- In August, attend Meet the Teacher and Family Connection Meeting. We can't wait to meet everyone!

#### Be Ready for the School Day

- Help your child build independence and master these skills before school.
  - Using the bathroom independently
  - Washing hands -make sure to scrub for about 20 seconds!
  - Opening food containers and eating lunch within 20 minutes, without prompting
  - Putting on footwear if they are unable to tie laces, slip-ons or Velcro are great!
  - Putting on a coat practice buttoning or zippering up
- Kids need energy to learn, play, and manage emotions. Ensure they are getting enough sleep (9-12 hours) and start their day with a nutritious breakfast.
- Consistent bedtime and morning routine get this started before school starts

#### Set Expectations

- Be a role model by showing your child a positive attitude about school and learning.
- Talk with your child about going to kindergarten and answer any questions they might have.
- Talk about how you expect them to behave at school and the importance of respecting teachers, students, and other staff.

#### Practice Skills at Home

- Read to your child and tell stories daily in English and/or your home language!
- Find the math in daily experiences (count, sort, name shapes, compare object, etc.)! Count or sort toys, laundry, food items\_anything and everywhere!
- Teach your child their full name and practice writing their first name.
- Use everyday situations to practice taking turns, sharing, and following routines.
- · Get plenty of exercise and spend time outdoors every day!
- Talk about feelings and help with calm-down strategies (such as taking deep breaths or counting).
   Help them use words to name feelings and solve problems.
- Encourage them to solve problems independently (try different ways). If needed, help them come up with solutions. Celebrate their efforts when they keep trying when things feel hard!

## 504 plan and Students with Disabilities

- A school-aged student is considered eligible under Section 504 if the student:

   Has a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities
- If your child already has a 504 plan, it will follow your child to Kindergarten.
- Talk to your child's school counselor (or pediatrician) to see if you child may qualify for a 504 plan.
- Check with the school counselor if you have any questions.



# **Special Education Program and IEPs**

- Schools are your partner in your child's development.
- <u>Schools have special education programs</u> to best serve and support students. It is not a stigma to be in the program.
- <u>All elementary schools have special education programs at school LRC (Learning Resource Centers)</u>
- If your child already has an IEP (Individualized Education Plan) from pre-school (ISD ECE (Early Childhood Education program), the IEP will follow them to the new school.
  - The school case manager will contact you.
- Please communicate with your school if you have any concerns about your child's academic, behavior or social/emotional growth.
- <u>Better if you can start the conversation and be proactive especially if you or your pediatrician have</u> <u>concerns.</u>
- If you have concerns about your child's development, the school district offers free screening through Child Find. <u>Child Find - Issaquah School District 411</u>



## **School Nurse and the Health Room Specialist**

- All elementary schools have a Health Room
  - If your child feels ill or gets hurt at school, they may be sent to the health room. Health Room specialist will contact you.
- Health Rooms are staffed by
  - School Nurse (Licensed RN)
  - Health Room Specialist (not a medical professional but an assistant similar to a Paraprofessional)
- Please be sure the school is informed about life-threatening condition for your child (Per Washington State law an emergency care plan needs to be in place with the school before the child can attend school). Examples include:
  - severe allergy (EpiPen has been prescribed),
  - diabetes,
  - severe asthma
  - seizure disorder
  - cardiac condition
  - adrenal insufficiency)
- Partner with the school nurse if you have any concerns and make sure the information in your Confidential Health form is UpToDate.
  - The school nurse can help connect you with medical providers, insurance, vision and dental provider if you need help
  - Kidvantage Resources (clothing and other items) if you need financial assistance





# **Immunization**

- <u>ISD and Department of Public Health Required Immunizations:</u> 2 doses of MMRs, 5 doses of DTaP, 2 doses of varicella, 4 doses of polio (IPV), 3 doses of Hepatitis B
- All incoming K students need to have a medically verified immunization record before the first day of school. (See school website for questions) Immunizations and Testing - Issaquah School District 411
- Your student may register for school, but MAY NOT attend school until provider-verified immunizations have been received and validated by the school nurse.
- If you have vaccine records coming from out-of-state or from another country, give us copies of any of those records.
- If you have questions or need help with vaccine resources or to make an appointment for vaccines, contact the school nurse.
- State law students are required to submit a completed <u>Certificate</u> of <u>Immunization Status</u> (CIS), or Certificate of Exemption (COE), that demonstrates a compliant immunization status according to state law **before** starting.

## School Counselors – Elementary School


(School Counselor contact list at all elementary schools)

- School Counselor at all schools to support the social, mental and academic development of the students.
- An elementary school counselor typically performs the following duties:
  - > Fosters good relationships with peers, parents, teachers, and other important people in the child's life
  - Not a stigma to see or talk to a counselor, social and emotional development of a child is part of the US educational focus.
  - > Encourages young learners to adopt a more positive attitude towards school and the learning process
  - > Peer group meeting (usually at lunch) and work with students on friendship issues.
  - Improves the communication skills of young learners, and helps them successfully develop effective decisionmaking strategies
  - Addresses developmental tasks, personal concerns, crises, peer conflicts, dysfunctional home environments, and physical disabilities, and offers helpful solutions

- No touching or rough play at recess

# **Specialist Teacher**

## Specialist Teacher – Certificated Teacher

- Students go to a "specialist" teacher for class in music, P.E. and library
- 2 PE, 2 Music and 1 Library each week PE, Library or Music
- Weekly schedule set at the beginning of the year and shared with families within first couple weeks.

# Para-Educators non-certificated staff

## **Para-Educators**

- Non-certificated teacher/school aide in school
- May work with your child in the classroom, playground, lunchroom or health room.





## **Elementary School Libraries in the ISD**

- Students visit the library with their class 1X a week.
- Students will check out books their choice.
- Librarian teaches them library skills, care of book, check out procedures, etc.
- Librarian does lessons with students and/or reads to students.
- Parent/Community volunteers in the library to help students check out books and shelve books.









# **School Events**

Some events may be school sponsored such as School Book Fair

- Schools host a book fair to help families see current books available.
- Books are listed by grade or reading level.
- Fundraiser provides schools some additional dollars for teachers or school libraries to get additional books for classroom or school library.
- Flyers will be sent home with book titles.

Some events – after school – by outside vendors. Listed in PeachJar – Chess, Drama, Piano.






# Elementary School




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# Bathrooms
