

From Fr. Eric:

Jesus' majesty during the Transfiguration

In today's Gospel, we see Jesus in all his glory, transfigured on Mount Tabor. Picture a split screen: on one side, Jesus is shining in radiance, transformed before Peter, James, and John (Luke 9:32). On the other side, Jesus is hanging on the cross, covered in blood, his body broken in agony.

The contrast between these two images can be shocking. How can the same Jesus, who was revealed in divine glory, also be the one suffering a humiliating death on the cross? The answer lies in his love for us. Jesus willingly accepted "death, even death on a cross" (Philippians 2:8) to save us. Out of love, he chose to let go of any display of his divinity and instead embraced the cross.

In the first reading from the Book of Daniel, we encounter a majestic vision of the "Ancient of Days" who sits on a throne, clothed in radiant white, symbolizing purity and divine authority. This vision culminates in the appearance of "one like the Son of man," who is given power, glory, and a kingdom that will never be destroyed. This imagery sets the stage for understanding Jesus' divine nature and His rightful place in God's plan for humanity.

The Responsorial Psalm echoes this theme, proclaiming, "The Lord reigns, let the earth exult". It emphasizes God's sovereignty and the revelation of His glory, which is essential for grasping the significance of the Transfiguration. The psalmist invites us to recognize the majesty of God, who is exalted above all.

In the second reading from 2 Peter, the apostle affirms the eyewitness testimony of Jesus' majesty during the Transfiguration. He recounts the voice from heaven declaring, "This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased; hear ye him". This moment not only confirms Jesus' divine sonship but also foreshadows the suffering He will endure, linking His glory to His ultimate sacrifice.

Finally, in the Gospel of Luke, we witness the Transfiguration itself. Jesus takes Peter, James, and John up a mountain to pray, where His appearance is transformed, and He converses with Moses and Elijah about His impending departure in Jerusalem. This scene summarizes the duality of Jesus' mission: His divine glory is revealed, yet it is intertwined with the reality of His suffering and death.

The Transfiguration is a moment where Jesus' true identity is revealed. When we think of Jesus in his transfigured glory, it deepens our gratitude for what he endured for us. As the divine Son of God, he could have called upon angels to save him from the cross at any moment. He could have unleashed his power and stopped his persecutors. But he didn't. He chose to suffer and die out of love—for all of us, even for those who condemned him.

Imagine yourself standing on Mount Tabor with Peter, James, and John. Picture Jesus' face shining with divine light, his clothes radiating brightness. What would you say to him? Above all, let your heart be filled with gratitude and thank him for the immense love that led him to the cross, so that we might have life.

"Lord, I would love to witness your presence today."
