- Purchasing supplemental staff/programs/materials/supplies
- Conducting additional parental involvement meetings/trainings/activities
- Recruiting/Hiring/Retaining Highly Qualified Teachers

School Wide Goals For FY25

ELA

By May 2025, we will improve AASA ELA proficiency scores from 29% to 39%

Math

By May 2025, we will improve AASA math proficiency scores from 20% to 30%

School Wide Goals for FY 25

Behavior

By May 2025, we will decrease suspensions off campus (unique incidents) by at least 25% when compared to the previous school year. (FY 24=11)

Family Engagement

By May 2025, we will increase the percentage of students "on track*" for attendance from 76% to 78%.

All Title I schools emphasize bringing in parents as academic partners and each school receives funding to further this partnership.


- DVUSD has a Title I Parent Engagement Policy and each Title I school has a parent involvement policy and parent/school compact.
