Superintendent's Corner

It is officially budget season in Mount Pleasant. There will be many more details coming between now and the May 20th vote, but we are pleased to share a few numbers with you now: The proposed budget of \$79,527,212 represents a \$242,000 decrease from last year's adopted budget, with a tax levy increase of 1.69% but an estimated tax rate decrease of 0.91%, providing approximately \$115 in annual savings for homeowners with an average assessed value of \$8,500.

As our seniors are announcing their post graduation plans, our 9th, 10th, and 11th graders are busy with their planning too! The very popular annual Coffee & College Night was well attended and provided invaluable information from college representatives, our counseling team, and even some WHS seniors.
