Press Release: South Shore School District Referendum Approved by Voters



[Port Wing, WI] – On behalf of the South Shore Board of Education, administration, staff and students, we would like to express heartfelt gratitude to our community upon the success of a \$14.75 million facilities referendum, with unofficial results indicating 58% voter approval.

The passage of this referendum will allow us to address critical needs in our building, including updates to heating, ventilation, and plumbing systems; construction of a secure entrance; expansion of classroom spaces and the fitness center; and ADA-compliant renovations. Serving the community since 1977, the building will undergo essential updates to continue providing a safe, high-quality learning environment for current and future students.

We are energized and inspired by the support from our community. The approval of this referendum reflects the powerful shared commitment to our schools, children, and the future. With these improvements, we’re creating safer, more efficient and more innovative spaces that will serve students and our community for generations. It’s been a privilege over the last few months to connect with so many residents who care deeply about our school.

Next, the design phase will begin, continuing for approximately nine months and involving ongoing discussions with district staff, community members, and other stakeholders to ensure the project reflects shared goals. Construction is expected to begin in spring 2026, with a thoughtful phasing plan allowing the district to sequence construction strategically to minimize disruption, maintain educational focus, and align with the needs of students and staff.

We sincerely thank you all for your engagement and support. We take this vote of confidence from our community very seriously, and will work hard to bring this investment in our future to life.

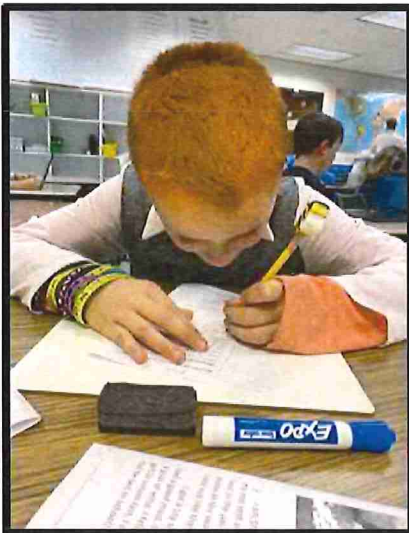
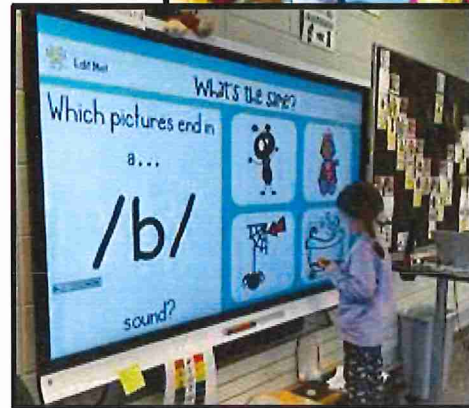
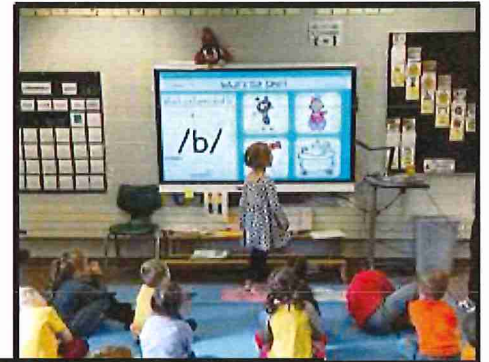
Spotlight on Student Learning: Professional Development

Teaching students to read is an art! It is the combination of the science of teaching students how to read while instilling the love of reading in our students. There is a lot of information in the news right now about the Science of Reading. Many states, including Wisconsin, have passed laws about teaching reading in alignment with the best practices that are outlined in the Science of Reading. At South Shore, our elementary teachers have embraced learning about and implementing these best practices. Our 4K-3rd grade teachers are completing intensive training through LETRS and our 4th - 6th grade teachers are continuing their learning about the Science of Reading and applying specific strategies through work around The Six Shifts. It is an exciting time at South Shore, and we wanted to take a moment to share what this looks like for our students!

Science of Reading

The Science of Reading comes alive in the classroom in many different ways! If you were to walk into an elementary classroom, you will see students reading in many ways throughout the day. In the early grades, you will hear students working together to break apart and put together the sounds in words. You may see them using the SMARTboard, using hand motions, writing on whiteboards, and even writing in the air as they actively engage with learning about how sounds and words work. Students across classes are listening to their teachers model reading, reading decodable texts together chorally, and working in small groups on their reading and spelling skills. They play games with their classmates to build their skills, and read decodable texts independently as they develop their identity as a reader. The results are amazing - our youngest Cardinals are quickly becoming readers!



Love of Reading

While our instruction is rooted in the science of reading, we cannot forget that we also want students to fall in love with reading. Our goal is to build readers who apply the skills they need to read as they read independently both in and outside of the classroom. To do this, South Shore is intentionally working towards building the love of reading through many opportunities including:

Visiting the Library: Our school librarian, Julie Branham, works with elementary teachers to ensure that all students have the opportunity to visit the library and check out or renew books to read for enjoyment every week.

High Quality Decodable Texts: One key component to having students begin to love reading is to ensure they have books they can read on their own! The South Shore School District recently invested in several high-interest decodable texts that are intentionally written so that students can read all of the words on the page. Students will be using the books in small groups before reading them independently as they become readers!

Battle of the Books: One of our teachers, Erika Suo, provides our students with an amazing opportunity. On Wednesdays after school, students in grades four through six read and discuss a variety of books. In the spring, they travel to Ashland to compete against students from other schools as they 'battle' over their knowledge from the books they read. Our students are looking forward to this after school opportunity, which starts in November. This year our school librarian

is working to provide this opportunity for our seventh and eighth grade students as well!

How You Can Help

Watching our youngest Cardinals become readers is exciting, and we need your help! If you have a student at South Shore, or even if you know a student at South Shore, here are a few things that you can do to help:

Reading at Home: Did you know that one of the best ways to build your child’s reading skills is to have them read? A child who reads for just 20 minutes a night will, on average, read an additional 1.8 million words in a year than a child who doesn’t read outside of school. Reading is just like a sport; it takes lots of practice to become a fluent reader.

• **Talk About Reading:** Do you know a South Shore student? Talk to them about reading! As a teacher, my teammates and I would annually invite race car drivers to come to our classes and talk to our students about reading. The drivers might talk about their favorite books, but they also often talked about how they used reading to help them as a driver. This helped our students see that adults in all professions were readers too! If you have the opportunity, share what you read with a student and ask them about what they are reading. Help them see that the adults in their lives are readers too!

This is an exciting year at South Shore, and we cannot wait to see the growth in our young readers by June, 2025!

Aleia has been working with the DAV, a program designed to support Disabled Veterans. As a junior member, Aleia has volunteered countless hours in our community and our region, serving disabled veterans in a number of ways. 
