Around the School

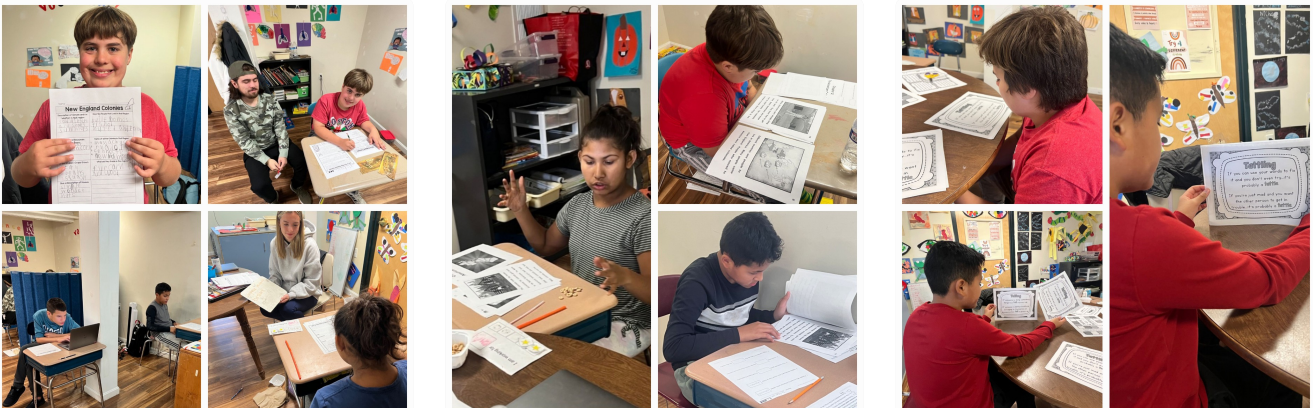
Ms. Stephanie's Class

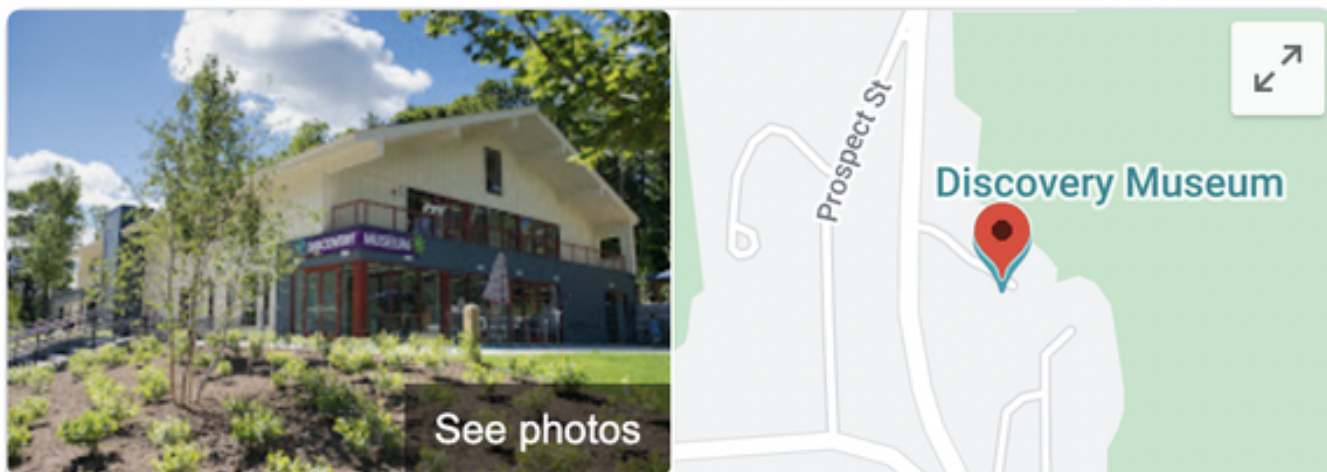
Walmart sensory friendly hours
