Minutes of the Regular Board of Education Meeting May 13, 2013

The Webutuck Board of Education held their May 13, 2013 meeting at 7:00 p.m. in the Webutuck High School Library.

1. CALL TO ORDER

President McGhee called the business meeting of May 13, 2013 to order at 7:00 p.m.

2. <u>EXECUTIVE SESSION</u>

Mr. Perotti made and Mrs. Boyd seconded a motion to adjourn to executive session at 7:00 pm for the purpose of discussing the employment history of a particular person or persons.

Mr. Perotti made and Mr. Trotta seconded a motion to adjourn the executive session and to reconvene the public session at 7:39 pm.

4. <u>2013-2014 PUBLIC BUDGET HEARING</u>

Ms. Moran made and Mr. Trotta seconded a motion to open the Public Budget Hearing. Ayes 4 Nays 0 The motion carried.

Mr. Gratto reviewed the 2013 – 2014 budget information that had previously been presented during several past Board meetings. Additionally, he reviewed the STEP increase for teachers, teacher and employee retirement costs and employee and retiree health insurance which are additional fixed costs in the budget. He reviewed what has been done to control costs and plans for the school year 2013-2014. He presented his most recent recommendation which would reduce the German position from .8 to .6 and use the \$20,000 saved from the reduction to maintain two part-time (.6) positions allowing the District to offer science electives.

Mrs. Harrington spoke to the Board about her German position being reduced to .6 cautioning that she felt strongly she wouldn't want to give students full credit for the year because they wouldn't have her full attention all year.

Dave Shufelt commented that most taxpayers do not understand teachers' STEP increases. He went on to say while a contract is settled the stated increase in salary is actually more due to the automatic STEP increase. He also spoke about the health benefit costs that continue to increase and the economic pressure of all the mandates on school districts. Audience members spoke about how to get the public out to meetings to understand budget information and the cost of education going forward. Discussion ensued.

Mr. Perotti made and Mr. Trotta seconded the motion to close the Public Budget Hearing. Ayes 4 Nays 0 The motion carried.

7. <u>SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT</u>

A. Berkshire Taconic Community Fund Donation of \$4000

Mr. Gratto reported that the BTCF received an anonymous donation for Webutuck in the amount of \$4000. It was added to the Webutuck Fund for Education Enrichment which brings the total amount in the fund to \$9000.

B. Date of Determination of Valedictorian and Salutatorian

Mr. Gratto explained that Mr. Sauer had spoken to Student Council and the Guidance Department for input. Student Council did not have a recommendation to change the date. Mr. Gratto recommended calculating the grade point averages (gpa) for class rank at the third quarter of senior year. Mr. Gratto also recommended developing a regulation which Board members were in agreement on. Discussion ensued.

Mr. Gratto reported that 1st and 2nd grade teachers are recommending the District continue the model they have currently, which is four first grades with one targeted group and a full time teaching assistant. Their recommendation is to move these students ahead into second grade with the same full year intensive support they have been receiving. Mr. Gratto supports the recommendation.

Mr. Gratto questioned if the Board decided to go with German .6 and .6 Science. The Board is in agreement, the German position will be reduced to .6 and we will have two .6 science positions.

President McGhee asked Mr. Markonic about the Millerton building and the energy audit. Mr. Markonic just received the audit back and will be discussing the options. President McGhee asked Mr. Markonic to keep him informed of any developments.
