BONDUPDATE

We cannot thank your community enough for supporting our work at Spring Lake Public Schools by supporting the May 2023 bond! We want to be clear that the images below are renderings--not finalized images. Those will be coming in February/March of 2024, but we wanted to share the early images with you now to show our pride in the progress.

Some facts about the major projects:

- Construction is set to begin in June 2024 with opening doors in Fall 2025
- The high school office and secure entry is a two-story concept featuring a main-level welcome center, offices, meeting spaces, and storage space. The second floor will house the counseling offices and meeting spaces. The total square footage is 7,503.
- The fieldhouse's main level will feature a 70-yard turf field, a weight room, the trainer's room, restrooms, mechanical necessities, an elevator, storage space, three lanes of straight track surface with high jump capabilities, and a 70-foot ball wall for lacrosse. The fieldhouse's mezzanine level will have dedicated space for wrestling and cheerleading overlooking the main level. The total square footage is 71,905.







FINANCIAL UPDATE

Our financial transparency is important to us and to our families and community. To that point, we will share a bit of information in each newsletter to help you understand what is happening in our district presently--and over time.

Revenue -- \$37,201,051

Expenditures -- \$35,773,988

Fund Balance -- \$6,620,705

What these numbers, by themselves, do not show is that this is the fourth straight year in which the fund balance increased.

From The Curriculum Director Kate Drake

Learning continues for both students and staff this 23-24 school year. One highlight involves multi-tiered systems of support (MTSS) for grades 5-8 around positive behaviors. By ensuring all students know, are trained in and acknowledged for expected behaviors throughout our campus, we are enhancing culture and shaping a path for strong academics. A key ingredient is consistency — which benefits our children.

Guided via a team of intermediate/middle school educators and resources, we have come together to craft this effort. Additionally, processes of identification and intervention for those who may need differentiated behavior support are next steps. Research-based best practices around behavior are points of ongoing learning and the team is grateful for a partnership with our county intermediate school district to help grow us.



Fundraising Success

All fall, Spring Lake Public Schools has taken on a lot of fundraising efforts and it has paid off. In total, the number nears \$150,000.

Fundraising supports several missions: reducing the cost of student experiences, providing unexpected kindness to the staff, donations to local charities, and more. In addition, it's a great experience for our students to get out and share their school experience while asking for funds.

Psssss! The air brakes hiss as the buses pull up to the elementary school for the start of 2023-2024 school year. Go ahead, take a look in the windows of those buses. What do you see? Happy faces, sleepy faces, excited faces, scared faces, worried faces, silly faces, new faces and familiar faces. You can see so many different emotions. But the best thing of all is when the bus driver opens the door and the kids run–not walk or trot but run–to get inside of their school. The wild thing is it's not even raining; it's a beautiful, sunny morning. They simply can't wait to get their new school year started.

This is my thirty-third year teaching Second Grade at Jeffers Elementary School. Every year it's the same but it never gets old: our students are truly excited to come to school! Their jaws are on the ground when I tell them 95% - 100% of my students are represented at Parent/Teacher Conferences both fall and spring, year after year. Spring Lake Public Schools is truly a special place.

If you want to see pure, true joy, watch the Spring Lake Elementary students get off those big yellow buses. You can't help but smile to yourself. Can you imagine what our world would be like if adults reacted the same way about their jobs as our kids do about their school? We can learn a lot from our Spring Lake Public School students! They are the best!



A FAMILY THAT COACHES TOGETHER: BOYS CROSS COUNTRY

Meet the Mitchells. Todd has been teaching and coaching Boys Cross Country at Spring Lake Public Schools for six years now in the math department.

Each of those six years, his wife, Anna, has been by his side-directly at his side as the assistant coach. It's not only Todd and Anna but their three young children as well.

Top 5 Athletic Highlights Fall 2023

- 1. The Girls Varsity Golf Team finished 4th in the state thanks to a stellar showing by junior, Zoe Dull, who was the state runnerup in individual scoring
- 2. Hannah Brown set a new school record in the 50-freestyle swim with a time of 24.60 seconds. That was good enough for 6th in the state.
- 3. The Girls Varsity Cross Country Team was seeded 8th going into the state meet. They left finishing 4th overall. Kyla Meyers was awarded All-State even though this was her first year in the sport.
- 4. The Girls Varsity Volleyball Team had an outstanding post-season run earning the right to call themselves District Champions.
- 5. The Varsity Football Team hosted its first playoff game at Grabinski Stadium in years.

Honorable mention: This fall marked the inaugural season for the successful field hockey team. The team got great participation numbers and was competitive on the field.





SPECIAL ALUMNI PROFILE LEO DONNER

Leo Donner is a 1974 Spring Lake High School graduate and was just named one of the "Best Scientists in the World" according to <u>Research.com</u>. (See the article <u>here</u>.)

Donner is a physical scientist who focuses his work on developing climate models by researching clouds and convection in the climate system. Donner works at the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) Geophysical Fluid Dynamics Laboratory (GFDL) in Princeton, New Jersey (1991-) and as a lecturer in the Department of Geosciences at Princeton University (1993-). He received his B.S. (Atmospheric Science) from the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor (1978) and M.S. and Ph.D. (Geophysical Sciences) from the University of Chicago (1981, 1983).

Leo is an inspiration to what our students can become with their dedication and hard work.
