





EXPANDED LEARNING with COLLEGE in the HIGH SCHOOL

Steilacoom High School was thrilled to announce the launch of the College in the High School (CiHS) program in the 2024-25 school year, in partnership with Central Washington University (CWU). This innovative program allows students to enroll in CWU courses taught by our own approved high school instructors, enabling them to earn both high school and college credits without ever leaving our campus, and it's completely free to all students.

The CiHS program currently offers a diverse selection of courses, including:

- Spanish I, II, III
- German I, II, III
- American Sign Language (ASL) I, II, III
- Physics Inquiry
- Biology
- Pre-Calculus I and II
- Math Functioning and Reasoning

Additional benefits of the CiHS program include:



Affordability: Students can earn valuable college credits at no cost.

Academic Preparation: Challenging courses help students develop the skills and confidence needed for post-secondary success.

Convenience: Taking college-level classes right at Steilacoom High School eliminates the need for transportation to a separate college campus.

CWU

This program is designed to bring the benefits of dual credit education directly to our students. By providing college-level coursework on our campus, students can learn in a familiar environment from teachers they already know and trust. This fosters a supportive atmosphere while removing barriers such as cost and travel often associated with earning college credits.

As we celebrate the program's inaugural year, our goal is to continue expanding by adding new courses each year. This ensures that students have increasing opportunities to explore advanced topics and prepare for their academic and career aspirations.



Each spring students in specific grades are assessed in Math, English Language Arts (ELA), and Science on state-mandated tests. Students proficiency in each subject area is scored on a scale of 1–4, as follows: Level 1 = not at grade level standard, Level 2 = approaching grade level standard, Level 3 = meets grade level standard, Level 4 = exceeds grade level standard.

Percentage of Steilacoom Historical School District students who met grade level standards by scoring a 3 or 4 in the spring of 2024.*





GOALS FOR CONTINUED IMPROVEMENT

It is important to remember that state-mandated tests only provide one data point each year. Our schools consider this data along with various other assessment scores, including class unit assessments and diagnostic assessments, to evaluate student learning and plan for instruction and support.

We are pleased to see improvement in our students' scores on state assessments, and use a variety of assessments to track academic growth. To maintain this positive trend, we will continue to monitor and adjust student achievement goals and action plans.

FOCUS EARLY LITERACY

Our K-4 literacy data reflects substantial progress in reading proficiency over the past year, achieved through the focused efforts of Operation ELEVATE, our DoDEA 23 literacy grant initiative. **The percentage of students reading at or above grade level increased by 7% in ONE year**, while the number of students reading below grade level decreased across all grades. These improvements demonstrate the impact of the targeted interventions, evidence-based strategies, and curriculum enhancements funded by the grant. Through Operation ELEVATE, we are continuing to provide personalized support to ensure all students build a strong foundation in reading and thrive academically.

Each year, our Maintenance Department conducts a detailed condition assessment for each of our buildings and schools. The detailed report for each school and the building components within each school can be found on our <u>district website</u>.

Anderson Island Multipurpose Building: 93.34% Cherrydale Primary School Main Building: 89.33% Chloe Clark Elementary School Main Building: 88.29% Pioneer Middle School Main Building: 92.48% Saltar's Point Elementary School Main Building: 92.45% Steilacoom High School Main Building: 88.90%

Note: Modular buildings do not receive formal condition assessments and are evaluated separately by the Maintenance Department.
