




LETTER FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT


SECONDARY SCHOOL RECOGNIZED WITH AP COMPUTER SCIENCE PRINCIPLES FEMALE DIVERSITY AWARD

Manhasset Secondary School has earned the College Board AP Computer Science Female Diversity Award for achieving high female representation in AP Computer Science Principles (CSP). Schools honored with an AP Computer Science Female Diversity Award have expanded access to AP computer science courses for female students in their communities. Award contenders must either have reached 50% or higher female representation in one of the two AP computer science courses or have achieved a percentage of female computer science exam takers that meets or exceeds that of the school's female population. Manhasset Secondary School was one of only 847 recognized for improving female representation in AP CSP.

Our educators are committed to providing young women with the tools necessary for them to be among our next generation of leaders and innovators in this exciting field.

SECONDARY SCHOOL EARNS AP HONOR ROLL RECOGNITION



Manhasset Secondary School has been named to the 2024 Advanced Placement Program (AP) School Honor Roll, earning platinum distinction, the highest honor a school can receive. This is the second consecutive year that Manhasset Secondary School has achieved this recognition.

The AP School Honor Roll recognizes schools that have done outstanding work to welcome more students into AP courses and support them on the path to college success. Twentynine Advanced Placement courses are offered annually at Manhasset Secondary School with over 620 students taking 1,791 exams during the 2023-2024 school year.

INSIDE THE CLASSROOM



DINO DIG AT SHELTER ROCK

Mrs. Shondelmeyer's kindergarten and first grade classes joined Mr. O'Brien in the Shelter Rock Science Lab to participate in a Dino Dig. During the first lab, the students learned how fossils are formed and created their own model of a fossil using clay and plaster of paris. When the students arrived for the second lab, the fossils were hidden in a tray of sand. They searched for their fossils using grid coordinates to keep track of what they found.

MASTERING MATH AT MUNSEY PARK

Fifth graders at Munsey Park worked independently and in small groups to find the volume of irregular shapes. The students built three-dimensional figures to reinforce their understanding in a hands-on way. They also discussed their strategies with one another, which solidified their understanding and exposed them to different problem-solving approaches.





STUDENTS TRAVEL TO ITALIA, VIRTUALLY!

Students in Italian 5 at Manhasset High School had the unique opportunity to participate in virtual field trips with a live tour guide, where they explored the historic cities of Venice and Milan in real time. They were able to interact with the guide and ask questions in Italian, as well as have the guide stop and elaborate on any 'stops' along the way. In the coming weeks, the students will be 'embarking' on virtual trips to Florence, Rome, Pompeii and Siena.

Congratulations to our girls and boys fencing teams for their repeat as Nassau County Conference II champions!




CROSS-COUNTRY RECORD BROKEN, AGAIN!
